Barrel and frame and crescent buttplate blued: Lever casehardened.
With standard Lyman front sight, Win. sporting rear and Winl adjustable tang peep sight.
Win proofed on top of frame housing, but not on barrel top or side.

With panelled to round top frame with additional screw on left side of frame to accommodate
the Frank Burton system of extractor for a rimless cartridge.
The hammer has the split hammer interlock feature (as found on all guns made for the
rimless type cartridges including the
International Match rifles in .30-06 Cal.

With the stock removed: There are no identification marks on the lower inside tang.
With the forearm " ; "3" for barrel wt. and the same 2 line cal. identification as
noted above just as it appears on top of the barrel. Identical.

The 9 M/M x 57 Mauser cartridge was first loaded by Winchester in 1905.
The 9 M/M caliber was never listed in any Winchester Catalog.
This gun is reputed as being the only one made by the Winchester factory and it as such
was a gun to test the above cartridge. The gun apparently by oral history was sold by
the firm to an employee some time prior to the Olin Corporation purchasing the Winchester
Repeating Arms Co. which occurred in 1931.
