

Special Renaissances Set of Four, Revisited!

Several months back, at the request of Rod Herrmann, I provided pictures of the four special Renaissance 9mm Hi-Power pistols I ordered on or about 1968. The reader might find of some interest how these four came about.

Having started serious Browning collecting a few years after graduating from college, I decided to order some special Brownings for myself, and Browning was fairly accommodating in those days! I ordered up some special Superposes, etc. Being well pleased with the results, I embarked on what I called my "Hi-Power Project".

I first approached Browning on having Hi-Powers made up in Renaissance models, a la tangent slotted models. Browning wouldn't go for it! Next, I tried just tangent models sans the stock groove. Again, they would have none of it!

Finally, being rebuked on the first two efforts, I got them to agree to make up four consecutive guns with basically the 22 Lr. Grade III design with dogs, birds, etc. Surprisingly, they warmed to the idea. I believe they thought it would make a nice option to their line.

I requested that one of the three top engravers at the time be assigned this task and that all guns would be done by the same Master Engraver. I didn't want two or three



different engravers doing this pro-

At this stage of my Browning collecting, I already had Superposes by A. Bee, R. DeWil and Marechal. I requested that one of these three top Master Engravers handle this project. Happily, R. DeWil performed the work and what marvelous craftsmanship is exhibited! Although, I'm sure A. Bee or Marechal would have achieved the same fine results!

The reader is directed to look at the accompanying photos and note the fine detail and master engraving displayed. I suggest that these are the finest Renaissance pistols ever crafted at the factory!

Also, I might add, since Rod's article and photos shown in our fine BCA newsletter, some readers sadly have chosen to "nay-say" these fine guns claiming, "No Browning Renaissances were ever signed, and these are obviously after market upgrades". It seems in every group or every club there are a few people who choose to run their mouths. As the reader can see, these self-proclaimed "experts", as usual, don't know what they are talking about!

These guns are identical in every respect, showing the attention to detail that the artist engraver took. The only difference in any of the four is that three are signed by
