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Colt Bisley Model Revolver; caliber 45 Colt; 6 shot; 7 ½ inch barrel; blued finish; case hardened frame and hammer; black checkered hard rubber grips with rampant Colt motif; properly addressed; completely original; serial no. 310020; shipped from factory in 1909; one gun shipment to Columbus, Ohio.

Colt Bisley Model Revolver; caliber 44-40; 6 shot; blued finish; case hardened frame and hammer; black checkered hard rubber grips with Colt motif; properly addressed and stamped on left side of barrel Bisley Model / COLT FRONTIER SIX SHOOTER; serial no. 245236; shipped in 1905; 3 gun shipment to Hibbard, Spencer, Bartlett and Company in Chicago.

These pistols are very scarce in the 7 ½ inch barrel length slightly less than 7000 Bisleys were made in 44-40 caliber and not many of these were in the 7 ½ barrel length; slightly over 8,000 were made in 45 caliber, but again a limited number were made with a 7 ½ inch barrel. Collectors rarely see a Bisley in 45 or 44-40 caliber with a 7 ½ inch barrel.

Both of these pistols are in excellent to near mint condition.

Both were acquired by Daniel Construction Corporation from Bill Spicer in October of 2000 and are the property of Daniel Construction Corporation.
