Remarks: As noted above, the records do not provide information with regard to the barrel length of subject revolver or the type of stocks. However, this is usually an indication of a 7 1/2" barrel length and walnut stocks as these were considered standard issue for that time period.

We trust you will find the historical information, retrieved from the original Colt shipping records, to be of interest.










Can-can girl carved in relief on a custom pair of ivory grips. Courtesy of Mr. Philip R. Phillips.

**Custom Engraved and Gold Banded
Colt Single Action Army Revolver**

Serial no. 126466, .45 caliber, 7¹/₂ inch barrel marked *Colt's Pt.F.A.Mfg.Co. Hartford, Ct. U.S.A. Depot 14 Pall Mall London* extensively scroll engraved and with double gold bands at breech end. Fitted with custom target blade sight. Top strap fitted with target rear sight. Frame, cylinder, hammer, trigger guard and back strap finely engraved with scrollwork and geometric motifs. Checkered trigger. Blued and casehardened finish. Hard rubber Colt eagle grips.

Condition: Near mint as refinished. Engraving and inlay non-factory.

**A. A. White Engraved and Gold Banded
Colt Single Action Army Revolver**

Serial no. 345974, .45 caliber, 7¹/₂ inch scroll engraved barrel with double gold bands at muzzle and breech and engraved behind sight with crossed sabers and numeral '7', for Seventh Cavalry. Blued and casehardened finish. Cylinder with double gold bands at rear. Frame with relief portrait of George Armstrong Custer on recoil shield. Gripstrap engraved *John S duMont* below low relief portrait of Sitting Bull. Mother-of-pearl grips.

Condition: Near mint as refinished.

**Custom Engraved Gold Inlaid Colt
Single Action Army Revolver**

Serial no. 5988, .45 caliber. 7½ inch barrel marked *Colt's Pt. F.A. Mfg. Co. Hartford Ct. U.S.A.* Scroll engraved overall and gold inlaid by Alvin A. White. Special double gold bands on barrel and cylinder. American Indian head portrait in gold high relief on left recoil shield and on top of backstrap a bust in gold of *Wild Bill Hickock*. High relief carved one piece ivory grip with dance hall girl motif on right side. Backstrap inscribed *C.M. Williams*. Signed by A.A. White under trigger guard strap.

Condition: Mint as customized.

Note: Number 59088 was custom engraved and inlaid by Mr. White in the mid 1950s. Only one other ivory grip with dance hall girl motif was carved by Mr. White.


