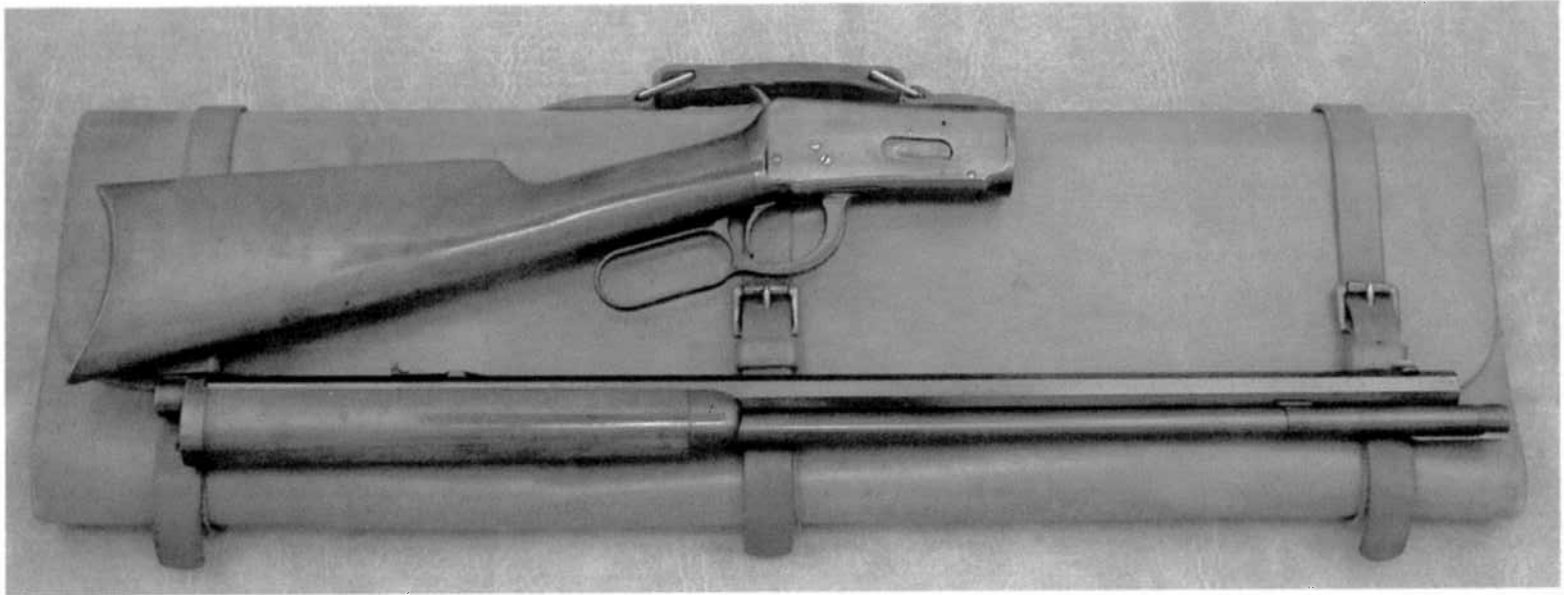

**Winchester 1894 Takedown Rifle w/Leather Heiser-Marked Carrying Case .30 WCF s/n 90238** mfg 1897 - 26" octagon takedown barrel; full mag; crescent buttplate; extra finish walnut stocks. Receiver retains 95% bright blue on left side; 80% bright blue on right side with a couple areas of surface erosion; Hammer and lever retain vivid case colors; barrel and mag retain 98% bright blue; buttplate retains full coverage of muted case colors; stocks are in excellent overall condition retaining almost all of their original case colors, with only minor handling marks; mechanics are excellent; bore is brilliant with little to no signs of use. The Heiser leather case is in superb condition, with clear markings visible: "H. H. Heiser - Maker - Denver, Colo. 445"; leather remaining supple and with only minor crazing at points near buckle areas. This rifle and case was obviously well taken care of by its original owner and would certainly be a prize in any collection of fine Winchester rifles and/or Frontier Americana.
