
Nice to get your letter with the color pic. I must say it does look like it could be of American manufacture, but being unmarked it's always open to speculation as you well know.



Well I can't find all the pics I thought I had, but here is one that should be pretty revealing. I'm not quite sure where I got this -- this is a merged image I made from two photos of the knife, one of the blade and one of the handle (why the owner did this, I have no idea.) Anyway the maker was John Friese of Baltimore and I think I've seen a couple like this. I feel like there is also a similar Samuel Jackson, but I can't find a photo of it.

I'm quite sure this knife is marked on the blade side of the guard. Friese was a surgical instrument maker like Jackson, 1 don't remember the exact wording of his stamp but it's a small, professional one piece stamp (something like Friese/Balto).


I think that Rick Mack owned one of these several years ago, in fact this may well be the same  $\mbox{\tt knife}.$
