## NOTES ON

### R.G. Owen Custom Sporting Springfield Rifle

#### Serial No. 655

Owen Custom Sporting Rifle, number 655, was received at Abercrombie & Fitch on July 15, 1929 and entered on page 485 of A&F Inventory Book No.5, the eleventh entry from the bottom of the page. R.G. (Bob) Owen began selling his rifles at Von Lengerke & Detmold in 1926 with serial number "01" which was received in inventory on October 26, 1926. Serial numbers 01 through number 30 were all received and sold at VL&D in 1926-27. A second range of Owen serial numbers beginning with number 510 was first received at VL&D in 1927. The significance of the two serial number ranges is uncertain. In 1929 Abercrombie & Fitch merged with Von Lengerke & Detmold under the A&F name and the combined store continued to receive Owen rifles through 1930 although unsold stock remained in inventory for several more years. A list of the serial numbers of Owen rifles sold at VL&D and A&F is enclosed.

On page 485 the date of acquisition appears in the leftmost column, followed by the serial number, caliber, barrel length, weight, barrel type and style. The model of the action is not specified, however, the notation "Star Gauge Barrel" indicates that the barrel and the action were from a model 1903 Springfield. The date of disposition appears in the column headed 'Consigned' and is followed by the name of the buyer. There are two dates of disposition entered. The earlier date "3/19/29" is the date that the buyer ordered the rifle from A&F. The later date "7/15/29" is the same as the date of acquisition indicating that the sale was entered when the rifle arrived since the buyer was already determined.

The buyer of Owen 655 is recorded as "D.B. Lee". Although the name is not uncommon, a careful review of the individuals with that name has not produced anyone who matches the profile of the typical A&F customer. However, the most likely individual with that name is Dwight Barlow Lee, born in Springfield, Ohio on March 20, 1874. Mr. Lee was the president and general manager of the Motor Products Corporation of Detroit, Michigan, one of the world's largest producers of automobile parts in the first half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. Although based in Detroit at the time of the

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purchase of Owen 655, Mr. Lee did travel through the port of New York on his way to and from Europe and could certainly have traveled there on business. Also, the order for the rifle was placed just a few days before his birthday suggesting a possible present to himself for his 55<sup>th</sup> birthday. In the 1930 census, Dwight B. Lee and his second wife, Gertrude Lescord, resided at 400 Burns Drive in an apartment along the Detroit River for which they paid \$600.00 per month rent. This was a considerable sum in the early years of the Great Depression and suggests a man who was quite well-off. Coincidentally, the Burns Drive area is now located in the Owen Park section of Detroit's "Gold Coast". A brief biography of Mr. Lee written in 1922 for the History of the City of Detroit is enclosed. Dwight Barlow Lee passed away in Michigan on March 5, 1942. He is buried near his birthplace in Stow Cemetery, Stow, Ohio.

I hope that this information adds to the appreciation of your firearm. If we can be of any further assistance, please let us know.

### R.G. Owen Custom Sporting Rifle No. 655

R.G. Owen custom sporting rifle, serial number 655, was a special order for a customer at Abercrombie & Fitch. The order was taken at Abercrombie & Fitch on March 16, 1929 and the rifle was entered into the A&F inventory on page 485 of Inventory Book No.5 on July 15, 1929. Records indicate that the rifle was built in the Mannlicher-Schoenauer style and further specifications for this firearm include:

Caliber:	30-06
Barrel:	22 inch Star Gauge barrel
Weight:	7 pounds, 10 ounces

On June 15, 1929 the rifle was sold to "D.B. Lee". The price of the rifle was charged to the customer's account.

Griffin & Howe confirms that this information was extracted from the original Abercrombie & Fitch Inventory Records, Book No. 5, page 485 on March 16, 2016.

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## Interpreting the VL&D and A&F Records

The VL&D Record Books begin in 1901 and cover the period through 1929. There are 3 volumes: Book 1 covers 1901 to 1909, Book 2 covers 1910 to 1922, and Book 3 covers 1923 to 1929. Most pages are limited to one make and model and each list for a given year begins on February 1st, probably following a January inventory of the firearms. The books include both new and used firearms. Used guns owned by VL&D are called "Second Hand Guns" while consigned guns are called "Guns Left for Sale".

Although there are exceptions to each of the following, generally the firearms in Book 1 describe only the gauge, barrel length, weight and D@H. The name of the purchaser is recorded if other than a 'cash sale'.

The firearms in Book 2 list the dates of acquisition and sale, most gun specifications and the purchasers but not the cost or price. The firearms in Book 3 list all of the above plus the price at which the gun was sold, in code.

Book 4 is a Von Lengerke & Antoine stock list of for 1913-1914 and includes many gun and non-gun items. The guns in Book 4 show only make, model and serial number. VL&A was purchased along with VL&D in 1929.

Beginning in 1929 the record books are labeled A&F and there are 28 volumes up through 1977. The A&F volumes cover a period of 1, 2 or 3 years. From this point the records show all of the above information in the VL&D books plus the cost to A&F and the retail price of the firearm. These costs and prices are shown in code until Book 16 in 1960 when they began to be recorded in dollars.

A line drawn through a serial number simply means that the gun had been sold. Unsold guns were transferred to the next year's inventory pages as of February 1<sup>st</sup>. Those transferred are often indicated by a red check mark. A large 'X' drawn across a page indicates that the inventory page had been completed. Serial numbers are almost never written in sequential order; rather they are by date of acquisition.

The name of the purchaser is often shown with an initial instead of the first name. The clients of A&F include some recognizable names and occasionally one will see entries for: WR Hearst, K. Roosevelt, (Kermit, son of TR), or JP Sousa, Jr (son of the conductor) among many others of note.

Stock dimensions, when listed, are in the order: Drop @ Heel, Drop @ Comb, LOP. Grip styles are listed as: "Str" (straight grip), "1/2" (semi-pistol grip) or "F" (full pistol grip).

Occasionally new gun sales were cancelled or the guns were returned by the buyer and resold. These were re-entered in the new gun listings with the name of the former owner written above the date of acquisition.

All of the records were handwritten by human beings. As such, there is always the possibility of human error. Occasional serial number and date errors have been noted therefore it is quite reasonable to assume that there will be some mistakes in measurements as well. You own a piece of firearms history. Please accept the documents for the historical perspective that they add to your firearm and do not be too disappointed if they fail to meet 21<sup>st</sup> century standards for mechanical precision or computer accuracy.

pany, also of the Cadillac Coal & Coke Company and a director of the Hammond Estate Company, the Hammond Building Company and the Superior Land Company. His interest in a project never ceased until he had successfully accomplished his purpose and in business he never failed to reach his objective. He worked persistently and energetically and seemed never at any time to neglect an opportunity that furthered his interests and promoted his legitimate success.

On the 16th of February, 1904, in Detroit, Mr. Skae was married to Miss Florence H. Hammond, who maintains her residence in Pontiac, Michigan, and who is the secretary and treasurer of the Hammond Building Company of Detroit, with offices at 1015-16 Hammond building.

Mr. Skae was well known in club circles, belonging to the Detroit Fellowcraft, the Detroit Yacht, the Country and Windsor Clubs, and his social qualities and genial nature made him very popular. He enjoyed yachting, automobiling and general outdoor sports and to these turned for recreation when his business permitted of leisure. His religious faith was that of the Catholic church and Mrs. Skae is very prominent and active in the church work, being president of the League of Catholic Women of Detroit and chairman of the Woman's Activities of the National Conference of Catholic Charities.

D. B. LEE is the president and general manager of the Motor Products Corporation, one of the largest and most successful manufacturers of automobile parts in the world, operating three plants. The main plant and general offices are located in Detroit, with branch plants at Ann Arbor, Michigan, and Walkerville, Ontario, Canada.

D. B. Lee was born on his grandmother's farm, near Akron, Ohio, on March 20, 1874, a son of Oscar C. and Angie A. Lee. He was reared in Cannelton, Indiana, on the banks of the Ohio river, where his parents moved when he was five years old, and where his father for the next twenty years was a manufacturer of clay products, stoneware, sewer pipe and drain tile. In his early youth he manifested a mechanical ingenuity which has been the basis of his business advancement and success, his first inventions being those relating to the clay-working industry and being developed and put into use in the factory of his father. When the bicycle began to come into general use he became very much interested in it and finally invented a bicycle crank hanger, from which he received no large compensation but a certain degree of recognition and which finally resulted in his leaving Indiana, at the age of twenty-two, for Worcester, Massachusetts, to accept a position with the Trinity Cycle Works as designer and chief draftsman, with which work he had little experience or training but he studied closely and employed his natural qualifications to good advantage. He also interested him-

self in the development and design of improved tools and machinery for making better and cheaper bicycle parts.

After three years he became general superintendent of the Manson Cycle Works of Chicago, employing seven hundred men. With this company he was connected for two years, leaving there to take the management of the Springfield Drop Forging Company of Springfield, Massachusetts.

The manufacture of automobiles was just then becoming a promising industry and he returned to the west two years later to become vice president, secretary and general manager of the Diamond Manufacturing Company of Detroit, Michigan, and Walkerville, Ontario, which company was one of the pioneers in the manufacture of automobile parts in Detroit. The development of the automobile industry gave him his opportunity and in May, 1916, the Diamond Manufacturing Company was amalgamated with the Superior Manufacturing Company of Ann Arbor, the Vanguard Manufacturing Company of Detroit, the Universal Metal Company of Detroit and the Rands Manufacturing Company of Detroit, to form the Motor Products Corporation.

The Detroit plant is located at Mack avenue and the Detroit Terminal Railroad, with sixty-two acres of ground and factory buildings of the most modern type, equipped with highly specialized machinery and tools for the manufacture of its products. The plants at Ann Arbor and Walkerville are smaller than the Detroit plant but both are specially equipped and have highly developed organizations for the product which they manufacture.

Mr. Lee is a Mason, being a member of the Palestine Lodge, King Cyrus Chapter, Michigan Sovereign Consistory, is a Knight Templar of Detroit Commandery, No. 1, and a Shriner of Moslem Temple. He is also a member of the Bloomfield Hills Country Club, Oakland Hills Country Club, of which latter he was one of the organizers and one of the first directors, the Detroit Athletic Club, the Detroit Club, and is a director of the National Bank of Commerce of Detroit.

C. BRYANT HUFF. Although but thirty-six years of age, C. Bryant Huff has had an eventful life of varied experiences, visiting many parts of the world and gaining that broad knowledge which comes to one through travel and keen observation. Nature has endowed him with many talents and for several years he figured prominently in theatrical circles of the country, while he is now capably filling the responsible position of secretary of the Michigan Engineering Society. Mr. Huff is a native of Iowa. He was born in Webster City, February 21, 1885, of the marriage of John B. and Abigail (Hopkins) Huff. His paternal grandfather was a native of the state of New York and in pioneer times he became a resident of Michigan, where he reared his family. The mater-
