The life story of Robert Stewart Dennee, is of a long and prosperous life. He was born in Fredericksburg township, town of Bathaniana Canada West (presently Ontario) in 1843. Robert Dennee came to the United States sometime before the war started and at 20 years old he enlisted on December 10th 1863 in the 7th Indep. Ohio Sharpshooters as a private. He was discharged for the 7th Indep. Ohio Sharpshooters only three months later on Feb. 10th 1864 to accept a officer commission as a 2nd lieutenant rank in the 10th Tennessee Mounted Calvary under Captain J.R.Paxton. . A quote from war department records are as follows, "enlisted as/in 7th indep. Co. Ohio Sharpshooter 12-10-1863 and discharged, no. 46, dated. From the Dept. of the Cumberland, Chattanooga Tennessee, Feb. 15 1864 to date from Feb. 10/64 to enable him to accept appointment as commissioned officer in the volunteer service co. as commanded by Cap. Watson.". Robert Dennee was in many engagements and battles although his record wasn't without blemish. He was dishonorably discharged, on AUG. 24th 1864. But that was later changed to dishonorably dismissed . Research shows why, which is very interesting, according to extensive records on hand, he was court marshaled and reduced in rank from 1st Lieutenant, to 2nd Lieutenant, and dishonorable dismissed for " " "Conduct prejudicial to good order and military discipline for upon marching of four Negro regiments thru Nashville Tenn. Saying to Cap'n Gotivald 4th v.b.c. "it is a shame or a disgrace to parade these negro troops through the streets" & also on a previous occasion, "it was a disgrace for any man to hold a commission in a negro regiment & that no officer in the regular Army of any self respect would recognize or hold fellowship with such negro officers".

It seems that Robert Dennee was a fine officer with high moral standards and high integrity but that didn't extend to marching beside "black folks". His high moral standards and integrity are evident from the handwritten note from his Captain Paxton to Gov. Johnson, stating as follows: 'Calvary corps, forwards this letter to Gov. Johnson with an urgent request that he should use his influence to have Dennee restored and if that cannot be accomplished that he be allowed a trial by court marshal, he states that Dennee is a young man of fine ability and a promising future was before him, previous to his dismissal. Gov Johnson, forwards the same remarking that Dennee was a good and meritorious officer who had rendered efficient service as adc to Geril Gillem during nearly all the time he had been an officer and recommends that he be allowed a trial and in the mean time be reinstated to 1st lieutenant. The judge adv. Geril says that in his opinion.....there is no doubt he is guilty of the offence charged, but the character shown as an officer , as shown by Col Spalding and Gov. Johnson, the order of dismissal should be revoked. Other actions in his behalf is for the secretary to be determined."

It is to note that Robert Dennee was a Union solder, if he had been a Confederate soldier things may have come about much differently as the North considered Negros somewhat differently than many Southern states.

After the war Robert Dennee moved to New Orleans Louisiana, got a law degree and became a lawyer. He married his first wife, Elizabeth Sinclair Dennee, whom was born in Scotland, and they over the years had 5 children, according to the Louisiana 1880 census records, only four had been born at that time, and they were Joseph Dennee, Jno.

Stl. Dennee, Marion Dennee, and Elizabeth Dennee. Annie St. Clair was his sister in law, also born in Scotland, and he had a live in cook, by the name of Elizabeth Carter whom was 27 years old. His wife died in 1893 from cancer, and he remarried on September 14th 1894 to Marie L.A. Grandjean in Atlanta Ga. Married by pastor J.B. Strickler, pastor. She had been born in Chaterrois, France and had never been married, nor did they ever have any children together.

Robert Dennee after a long life died Feb. 3rd 1905 from throat and tongue cancer (lingual carcinoma) and at the time of death lived at 1155 magazine street New Orleans La.

His wife, after her husbands death, moved back to Columbia, South Carolina and applied for a widows pension which she was approved, but it was cancelled Aug 27th 1917 and after several petitions by several different lawyers and appeals gave up on the process.

There is so much documentation about Robert Dennee in this folder that the above summary of his life is very skim and one would find the history in the following documentation very interesting and complete to a fantastic degree. I have been to his address and stood imagining a day long gone, where a lawyer had an office there by the name of Robert S. Dennee, atty. At law.....It is intriguing to me to follow some ones life and death with such in depth knowledge, so long after his death. I appreciate his service and I relish the opportunity to be another steward of his fine Henry Rifle! May he rest in peace.....

AN ACT

To increase the pension of widows, minor children, and so forth, of deceased soldiers and sailors of the late civil war, the War with Mexico, the various Indian wars, and so forth, and to grant a pension to certain widows of the deceased soldiers and sailors of the late civil war.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled. * * * * *
Sec. 2. That if any officer or enlisted man who served ninety days or more in the Army or Navy of the United States during the late civil war, and who has been honorably discharged therefrom, has died, or shall hereafter die, leaving a widow, such widow shall, upon due proof of her husband's death, without proving his death to be the result of his army or navy service, be placed on the pension roll from the date of the filing of her application therefor under this Act at the rate of twelve dollars per month during her widowhood, provided that said widow shall have married said soldier or sailor prior to June twenty-seventh, eighteen hundred and ninety; and the benefits of this section shall include those widows whose husbands, if living, would have a pensionable status under the Joint Resolution of February fifteenth, eighteen hundred and ninety-five; July first, nineteen hundred and two, and June twenty-eight, nineteen hundred and six.

Sec. 3. That no claim agent or attorney shall be recognized in the adjudication of claims under the first section of this Act, and that no agent, attorney, or other person engaged in preparing, presenting, or prosecuting any claim under the provisions of the second section of this Act shall, directly or indirectly, contract for, demand, receive, or retain for such services in preparing, presenting, or prosecuting such claim a sum greater than ten dollars, which sum shall be payable only upon the order of the Commissioner of Pensions by the pension agent making payment of the pension allowed; and any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this section, or who shall wrongfully withhold from the pensioner or claimant the whole or any part of a pension or claim allowed or due such pensioner or claimant under this Act shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall, for each and every such offense, be fined not exceeding five hundred dollars or be imprisoned at hard labor not exceeding two years, or both, in the discretion of the court.

Approved April 19, 1908.

Section 3 of the Act of Congress, approved by the President September 8, 1916, reads as follows:

Sec. 3. That any widow, as described in Sec. 2, of the Act approved April 19, 1908, who married the soldier or sailor prior to June 27, 1905, shall have title to pension under the provisions of said section of said Act, to commence from the date of filing her application in the Bureau of Pensions after the passage of this Act: Provided, however, That where a pension has been granted to a soldier's or sailor's helpless or idiotic child or children, or child or children under the age of 16 years, his widow shall not be entitled to pension under this section, unless the pension to such child or children has terminated, or unless such child or children be a member or members of her family and cared for by her, and upon allowance of pension to the widow, payment of pension to such child or children shall cease.




