

I acquired my Colt sign from Mr. Mack Schwinger. I sold this sign to Mr. John Godroe. Prior to my possession of the sign, Mr. Martin Huber, who was Colt's Historian at that time, said he would take walks around the plant during his lunch time and recalled seeing this sign on the Boiler Room wall. My sign had originally painted with a maroon background with white lettering and had been painted over many times. I had it sandblasted and I painted a blue background and white lettering. There was another Colt sign on the actual boiler itself. I was told a construction worker took that sign which ended up being listed on E Bay. I couldn't get the sign looked exactly like mine. I hope this letter helps you.
