

# Judge George Greene

(July 11, 1950–January 1, 2014)

George Greene was born in Columbus and later graduated from Auburn University in 1968 later from Alabama Law School in 1972. He worked as an Assistant District Attorney until 1972 when he was appointed District Judge, a post he held for almost 19 years, then he was appointed Circuit Judge, a post he held until December 1, 2013. The honorable Judge Greene was one of the longest serving judges in Alabama history with over 34 years of continuous dedicated service.

Judge Greene’s passions in life were very much involved in state, civic and public service to which he dedicated a great deal of his time and energy; this included the establishment of the “Cora Reed Greene Home for Children.” He was a member of the Trinity United Methodist Church where he taught the Jane Gullatt Sunday School Class and was the founder of the Greene Museum in Phenix City.

He was also a passionate and avid collector and researcher of history and historical items and over the years became highly regarded for his in-depth research and exemplary collection. His collection of historical items of which he was most passionate about were many years in the making and eventually became part of a Museum which he opened to share his collection with the public.
