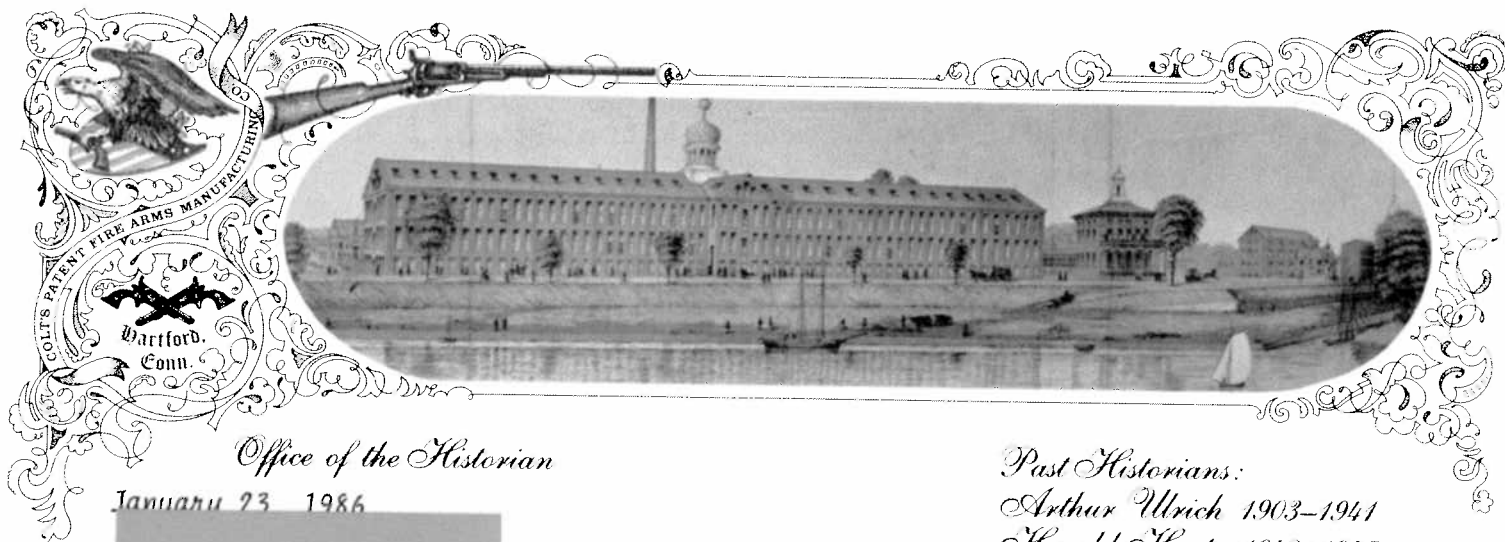

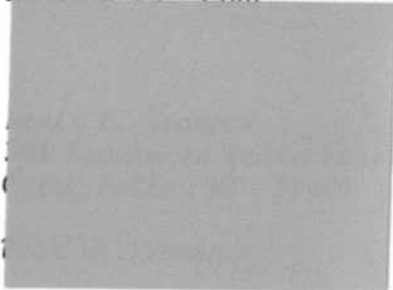
The Colt letter states the caliber to be .32-20  
Perhaps it may have left the factory originally in that  
caliber, as the gun definately is refinished.

It it is also very possible that the gun may have been  
refinished and the caliber changed at that time as the  
barrel and cyclinder and the gun on its own merit  
bears that out and the markings of IO42-B and IO-36  
stamped on the under side of the trigger guard on the  
frame and also stamped on the frame under the grips  
would bear its retention as a Factory reworked item.
