Thanks for the information on your Colt Single Action #49870. You are aware that this gun is well within the H.N. Series of nickle S.A.'s. The best way I believe to check if the gun is original nickel is to check the way it was polished, if it corners are rounded or scuare. Also the stampings would be isint and kind of blurred together.

I personallywould have my doubts that it was refinished as the chances are against it. First of all it is in the ser. no. range of the nickeled guns, secondly it is a "U.S." model known to be nickeled. Don't worry about the Colt letter, I have never seen one that said the gun was finished in nickel.

My article on the U.S. models is finished and now being typed. I only have the photo work to do yet. I am also having a complete CHART printed which will show the MARTTAL Single action story at a glance. As soon as these are ready I will send you a copy....
