

Fredrick P. Hatchins who was ENROLLED on the 11 day of Jan<sup>u</sup>ary, 1864, in company 16 of the 5<sup>th</sup> regiment of Mass Vol and was honorably DISCHARGED at Boston on the 10 day of Aug<sup>u</sup>ust, 1865; That his

personal description is as follows: Age 65 years; height 5 feet 6 inches; complexion dark hair dark; eyes dark. That while a member of the organization aforesaid, in the service and in the line of his duty at Ormeau Letter Day in the State of Penns<sup>u</sup>ie on or about the 1 day of Feby, 1864 he had broken his left leg in the battle of the Hillman's bar in Penns<sup>u</sup>ie had contracted large and watery varicous veins in both legs and had injuries to right knee so badly disabling him for future service
