

I, Stanton Magid, do swear that the following statements are sworn to be wholly truthful under pain and penalty of perjury.

The Italian manufactured semi-automatic handgun, serial number 161372 being offered for sale was owned by Jack Ruby, the historical figure known to have shot Lee Harvey Oswald. Oswald is accused of assassinating President John F Kennedy.

This specific gun was given to Eva Grant, my grandmother, upon the arrest and incarceration of Jack Ruby, her brother and my great-uncle. Eva Grant gave the gun to my father, her son, Ronald Magid. My father gave the gun to me. The gun has remained in my possession since it was given to me. The ammunition being sold with the gun was provided by my father. This gun was commonly carried in Uncle Jack's boot as a hidden backup firearm.

The Empire State Bank Deposit bag accompanying the gun came from my grandmother, Eva Grant, to my father who gave it to me. This bag was used daily by my Uncle Jack to make cash deposits from the proceeds of his two nightclubs in Dallas, Texas.

Supplemental documents were in the possession of my father when he passed away and are included with the gun and bank bag as part of this Jack Ruby related collection.



In 1952 Jack Ruby made three tape recordings at his newly purchased "Bob Wills' Ranchhouse" near Dallas. These (non-political) tapes of he with "Country & Western" entertainers of that era are available for Auction to the highest bidder over the minimum bid. The list follows. The minimum bid is \$ 5,000.00 (plus commission).

2) One of his other pistols: A 25 cal. Italian Semi-Automatic pistol, Serial # [redacted] Minimum bid \$30,000.00 (plus commission).

3) His Polaroid camera mentioned on page 345 of the condensed "Warren Report" Model 900, Serial #E510652. Minimum bid \$3,500.00 (plus commission).

4) Two ugly paintings which were part of the decor at one of his Nightclubs. Minimum bid \$1,500.00 (plus commission).

5) Picture of his favorite Dashund "Clipper" done in charcoal and tempera chalk(?) signed by J. A. Whitebird 1959. Minimum bid \$3,500.00 (plus commission).

6) Green Necktie with pattern labeled "CUSTOM MADE FOR Jack Ruby". Minimum bid \$750.00 (plus commission).

7) His collection of mostly Jazz records, **78 RPM**, from the 1930's and 1940's. These include Duke Ellington, Dizzy Gillespie, Roy Eldridge, Lionel Hampton, Charlie Parker, Sarah Vaughn and others. He also had a few **33 RPM** recordings of Show tunes and Dance music. There are probably close to 100 recordings in all. Except for the tapes and the tie, these items were sent to me from my Uncle Jack soon after January 1st of 1964. The tie was given me about 1950.

The tapes were made when he was attempting to promote Sunday Afternoon Dances. This was not appreciated by the Dallas Churches and he soon stopped. When I was in the Army, in 1953, he sent them to me to entertain the troops and I have saved them.

was fully capable of defending himself.<sup>109</sup> Another friend described Ruby as quick tempered and, though unlikely to pick fights, willing to accept any challenge without regard to the odds against him.<sup>110</sup> Young Jack also interfered in fights, particularly when the person he was aiding appeared to be taking a severe beating or in a disadvantageous position.<sup>111</sup> Others reported that he had the reputation of being a good street brawler.<sup>112</sup> One school friend recalled that when Jack argued vehemently about sports, he occasionally used a stick or other available weapon. He reported, however, that after Ruby's anger subsided, he reverted to his normal, likable character.<sup>113</sup>

From early childhood, Jack Ruby was called "Sparky" by those who knew him.<sup>114</sup> According to his sister Eva Grant, the nickname derived from the way Jack wobbled when he walked. He was thought to resemble the slow-moving horse called "Sparky" or "Sparkplug" depicted in a contemporary comic strip. Mrs. Grant testified that her brother became incensed when called "Sparky" and that from the time he was about 8 years old he would strike anyone calling him by that name.<sup>115</sup> A childhood friend also recalled that Jack hated the nickname and would fight when called by it.<sup>116</sup> Mrs. Grant was unsure whether the nickname "Sparky" did not also result from his quick reaction to the taunts of young friends.<sup>117</sup> Hyman Rubenstein thought that the nickname derived from Jack's speed, aggressiveness, and quick thinking. The many accounts of Ruby's lightninglike temper lend credence to the theory, widely held, that his nickname was connected with his volatility.<sup>118</sup>

## YOUNG MANHOOD (1933-43)

### San Francisco (1933-37)

Jack Ruby reported that in about 1933, he and several Chicago friends went to Los Angeles and, shortly thereafter, to San Francisco.<sup>119</sup> Although there is evidence that he stayed there until 1938, 1939, or 1940,<sup>120</sup> Ruby stated that he returned to Chicago in about 1937,<sup>121</sup> and this appears to have been the case.<sup>122</sup> Eva Grant testified that Ruby went to the west coast because he believed employment would be available there.<sup>123</sup>

Eva, who married Hyman Magid in Chicago in 1930,<sup>124</sup> was divorced in early 1934, and in about June of that year joined her brother Jack in San Francisco. She and her son, Ronald, shared an apartment with him. In 1936, Eva married Frank Granovsky, also known as Frank Grant, in San Francisco, and Ruby shared a four-room apartment with them and Ronald for a short while.<sup>125</sup>

### Occupations and Activities

Ruby stated that when he and his friends arrived in Los Angeles, they sold a handicapper's tip sheet for horseraces at Santa Anita race-
