Dear Sir:

We have received the gun #85954 which you shipped us under date of October 15th. We find upon tracing our records that this gun was made and shipped in 1896.

A gun of this grade today would cost \$610.00 and we believe sold from \$500.00 to \$400.00 at the time it was made.

If we cut the barrels down to 26" you will have no choke whatever in either barrel and it will be as you surmise, plain cylinder bore.

These barrels are made of Whitworth steel as stated, and are an expensive pair of barrels with a right hand slight choke and left hand full choke, and it really seems too bad to cut this off, although of course you know best what you desire. It will cost about \$5.00 to cut them off and retarget, finishing them as they are at present.

We can remove the recoil rod and fit a metal skeleton butt plate and estimate the cost for doing this and engraving the butt plate in the same style in which the rest of the gun is engraved, at about \$15.00. This necessitates checkering the wood at the butt end of the stock and probably will shorten the stock a little more than you realize.

We estimate that it will make the stock about 13 $\frac{3}{4}$ " whereas it now measures 14 $\frac{3}{4}$ ".

We will hold the gun awaiting your instructions.


