History

The Paradox ball and shot gun went into production in May of 1886 and remained in production until 1933. During this period a total of 453 Royal hammerless sidelock Paradox were produced. As part of this there were sidelock guns that were classed as "Extra Best" in the Sales/Order Books. These guns were often recorded as Royals in the number books, which at that time were at the Holland & Holland factory. It is only through the Sales/Order Books that these guns can be identified. The Extra Best denoted a more finely finished gun, usually with fancier wood and often more elaborate engraving. The Extra Best guns start with Paradox No. 15500 that was finished in September 1900. The production of the Extra Best ran to April 1903 with number 15641 (although one, No. 15838, dated to 1907). At that time, the Model de Luxe started with No. 15626, a hammer ejector made for the Maharaja of Kolhapur.

It appears that the Extra Best was a transition model for Holland & Holland to the Model de Luxe. In 1900, the company was a public company and was managed by Harris Holland and was still climbing the ladder of the British gun trade. At the time it did not have any British royal patrons and was slowly gaining the patronage of the aristocracy. The introduction of the Best Quality appears to be a trial to see if there was a market for a deluxe model and more

importantly see if a market could be developed. At the time a standard Royal Paradox cost 65 Guineas and the Extra Best was 70 Guineas. The trial was successful and the Model de Luxe appeared in the 1904 catalog at a price of 80 guineas. In all, there are 18 Extra Best Paradox recorded.

Extra Best Paradox Number 15589

Extra Best Paradox Number 15589 was ordered on Wednesday February 12, 1902 and was the 11th Extra Best Paradox ordered. It was ordered by:

C. H. Moseley, Esq.
17 Poolsed Place, Connaught Square,
London.

The instructions included the following:

“Goes to range to be fitted.”

“Engrave oval C. H. M.”

“Weight of gun as light as possible.”

“Gun must be finished by end of October certain.”

Mr. Moseley was fitted at the shooting ground, he was charged for 50 cartridges for 5/3 and 27 clay pigeons for 2/3.

The order was given to the factory and numbered, 1569. The action and barrels came from stock. It was sent for stocking on March 1, 1902 and was shot at the range on April 16 for accuracy. It was proved and regulated for the standard 12 bore Paradox load of 3 drams of Black Powder with a 750-grain bullet. The shotgun pattern was, right barrel – 148 and the left – 140 with 1 1/8 ounce of

number 6 shot, this equates to an Improved Cylinder choke. The average pattern for this gun was about 5% better than the average pattern for an average 12 bore Paradox. The gun was sent back to the stocking shop on May 20 and was made-off and stripped. The final stock dimensions were:

Bend: comb: 1 1/2 inches, heel: 1 7/8 inches.

Length: 13 7/8 inches.

Cast: 5/16 + 1/4 + 3/16 inches.

It was sent for engraving on July 5 and for hardening on August 23. It was sent for finishing on September 20. It was then cased with a leather case stamped C. H. Moseley. The accessories included snap caps and cleaning implements. He also purchased 50 Paradox bullets for 10/6. The total charges were 78/19/6.

The gun appeared again in Holland & Holland records in February 1947 when it was sold to Levetus Limited for shipment to Elahi Bukish & Co. Delhi, via Bombay. It was described as: A S/H (second hand) H'less ejector Paradox Ball & Shotgun. 28 inch barrels, two triggers, Half-pistol hand stock. Weight 7 1/2 pounds. Length: 14 inches. Leather case and tools. Nett 100 (pounds). The gun and pair of Royal 12 bores (No. 17105/6) were packed in a tin lined box and shipped via the steam ship "Empire Glory" on March 15, 1947.

Dear Herb,

I have done a lot of research on your Paradox no. 15589 and I am afraid I have only had partial success.

I can find nothing on Mr Levetus. I searched all the 1901 census returns for Great Britain but nothing turned up. It is very difficult without a Christian name or address. I think he might have lived outwith Great Britain.

However I can tell you about Mr Moseley. He ordered the Paradox originally and for some reason cancelled his order. The Hon. Charles Herbert Harley Moseley was born on the 7th August 1857. He joined the civil service and by 1884 was Assistant Colonial Secretary in Sierra Leone. He took part in several expeditions to quell tribes. He was Treasurer of Gambia in 1891 and again assisted naval and military forces to quell discontent. In 1894 he transferred to Lagos. In 1902 he was the Acting Governor of Lagos. No doubt he wanted the Paradox for use in Lagos. In London he lived at 67 Carlisle Mansions, Carlisle Place and if you want to phone him, his number is Victoria 4605!

Because I have had only partial success, I feel I cannot ask you for anything. Please get in touch if you want any further information on any of your collection.





KILLED IN ACTION**LIEUT. ARTHUR LEVETUS.**

Our Perth correspondent telegraphed last night to the effect that Mrs. Levetus had received word stating that her husband, Lieutenant Arthur Levetus, was killed in action on July 28.

For the space of two or three years Lieutenant (then Mr.) Levetus was a prominent figure in Kalgoorlie and Boulder. Little is locally known of his personal history before arriving on the goldfields. He was of English extraction, his father being either a Manchester or Birmingham merchant. Mr. Levetus was of an adventurous disposition, with a penchant for travelling. He went to India, where he stayed for several years. He was engaged in commercial pursuits and for a time was a sporting journalist on the Calcutta press. Whilst in India he acquired a certain degree of military knowledge, serving in a volunteer corps. When he came to Kalgoorlie he occupied a clerical position with the Swan Meat Butchering Company, and was instrumental in forming the Clerks' Union. He took over the position of organiser of that body, and it made progress under him. Mr. Levetus afterwards took over the management of the "Westralian Worker" when it was printed and published in Kalgoorlie. The headquarters of the journal were transferred to Perth, and Mr. Levetus became branch manager, combining business management with the duties of correspondent. Mr. Levetus became a much appreciated member of the Goldfields Journalists' Association, and at a later period acted as its representative on the executive in Perth. Mr. Levetus succeeded Mr. A. S. McIntock as hon. secretary of the Esperance Land and Railway League. He took a great deal of interest in the work of organising the Y.A.L. on the goldfields and devoted all his spare moments to furthering its objects. His military experience stood him in good stead, and he took a commission as lieutenant in the ranks of the senior cadets. He took part in many other activities on these fields. He had a wonderful capacity for work and organisation. His ability was recognised when he was transferred from the post of branch manager in Kalgoorlie to take over the control of the business affairs of the "Westralian Worker" in Perth. His interest in military affairs continued. He accepted the position of an area officer in the Perth district in addition to his other engagements. Some time after the war broke out, although his services were needed for instructional purposes, he could not resist the call from the front.

not resist the call from the front. He enlisted in the A.I.F. and was immediately given a lieutenancy. He left for "somewhere at the front" and, as it is now learnt, he gave his life for his country's sake. Mr. Levetus was a hustling, active man of more than average intelligence, and when people came to know him for what he really was, they were proud of the possession of his friendship. Labour circles on the goldfields will hear with regret that a promising life has been suddenly cut short. He was married a year or two before his departure from Kalgoorlie. Much sympathy is felt for his widow in her bereavement.

Dr. Rentoul, chaplain-general (Presbyterian) of the Victorian military forces, has been appointed by the military authorities to visit the military camps and hospitals in England to examine and to report upon the organisation of the chaplaincy staff and hospitals at the French front and in Egypt (says the Melbourne "Argus"). He will be absent probably for about five months.
