Boss Side by Side Shotgun
Serial No. 8163

Boss shotgun, serial number 8163, was first entered into the Abercrombie & Fitch inventory on September 1, 1937. The shotgun is described as a Boss 12 gauge shotgun with a barrel length of 25 inches and a single selective trigger. The shotgun was custom ordered by "H. Root Stern", actually Henry Root Stern. Mr. Stern, born in New York on September 22, 1882, was a prominent New York City attorney at the time of the purchase.

It is quite unusual that the physical specifications are not written in the record other than the gauge, barrel length and type of trigger; however, as the shotgun was a special order gun there may have been no need to do so as the gun was already 'sold'. The disposition date of the Boss is also September 1, 1937, the same date as the gun was entered into inventory. This was common for guns that were special ordered through A&F. As the entry "Direct" appears after Mr. Stern's name, it is also possible that Mr. Stern purchased the shotgun directly from Boss & Co. and A&F facilitated the importation of the firearm to the United States as A&F was the Boss & Co. representative in the USA.

It is to be noted that Mr. Stern also received two other Boss shotguns on the same date. These were very likely a matched pair, with serial numbers 8495 and 8496.

Griffin & Howe confirms that this information was extracted from the original Abercrombie & Fitch Inventory Records, Book No. 7, Sec. 2, page 11 on February 19, 2009.



H. ROOT STERN

Henry Root Stern was born in New York City on September 22, 1882. Along with the Certificate of Inventory & Disposition, Griffin & Howe has enclosed a variety of copies of documents from the public records referencing Mr. Stern. These documents include:

From the "History of the Class of 1903 – Yale College", a 3 page 'biography' about Mr. Stern written about 1906 describing his background and accomplishments and contributed to by Mr. Stern himself. This document gives a brief personal look at the early life of Henry Root Stern

The passport application of Henry Root Stern dated May 12, 1924. Included is a physical description as well as a photograph of Mr. Stern at the approximate age of 41 years. Described on the application is his itinerary for a 3 month trip to Europe

The 1900 census page on which Mr. Stern appears in New Haven, CT as a student at Yale

The 1920 census on which Mr. Stern is listed as a resident of Manhattan and working as a lawyer. Also in the household are his wife, Elsie, his son, Henry R. Stern, and two servants

The 1930 census on which Mr. Stern is listed as a resident of New Hyde Park, Nassau county, Long Island, New York. He is shown as a lawyer in general practice. The next page of that census lists the twelve servants residing in his household at that time.

Dear Mr. Hyatt,

I planned to email you later today and suggest that you do just that. The other 2 guns were numbered 8495 and 8496, possibly a matched pair. Actually, there appear to have been five Boss shotguns, all received on the same day (9-1-37) and all entered in the same hand with the same pen. Interestingly, the serial numbers of those other than the one about which you inquired are in the manufacture range for 1937 - numbers: 8495, 8496, 8346, and 8459. The last 2 guns were for different customers, one each. I assume that they all arrived in one shipment. I am curious as to why number 8163 was sold as late as 1937. Perhaps Boss will know. Of further interest is the word 'DIRECT' where the salesman's initial would be and the fact that there is no cost or price indicated for these 5 guns. While American gunmakers sometimes would ship a gun direct to an A&F customer after they had ordered it from the store, I don't imagine that a foreign maker could do that easily what with customs duty, excise tax, and significant shipping fees involved. Just after the column where the price should appear is written "C.R. 9/10". If you speak to Roy Liu at Boss & Co. please give him my regards.

Now as to H. Root Stern, his name was Henry Root Stern, born Sept. 22, 1882 in New York City. He graduated from Yale in 1903 and was a prominent lawyer. His son, H. Root Stern, Jr., became the Supt. of Insurance for New York State and died in 1993. Assuming that the elder Mr. Stern passed the guns to his son, perhaps the guns went on the market after the death of the son. I do not know if the son had any children. The more one learns the more questions that arise.

Although the documentation about the gun is minimal we could provide a Certificate and include a separate page of Notes about the owner and, of course, the photo of the records page. The research fee is \$50. If that is not necessary, I'll be happy to send you the copies of the documents that I found about the owner at no charge. Just provide your current mailing address.

I hope that you have good luck with your inquiry at Boss & Co.

 > Boss shotgun, number 8163, does appear in the Abercrombie & Fitch records. The gun was entered in the inventory list on September 1, 1937. Unfortunately, this gun and 2 additional Boss guns were special ordered for the customer and they were apparently shipped directly to the customer and no specifications are recorded other than gauge and barrel length. This is not common but it did occur. The customer was "H. Root Stern" and the disposition date was the same as the acquisition date further indicating that the guns were special order. I will see if there are any documents in the public records regarding Mr. Stern but unfortunately a Certificate could not provide many details about the gun in its original configuration. I will email you again after I have had a chance to look up Mr. Stern.

Interpreting the VL&D and A&F Records

The VL&D Record Books begin in 1901 and cover the period through 1929. There are 3 volumes: Book 1 covers 1901 to 1909, Book 2 covers 1910 to 1922, and Book 3 covers 1923 to 1929. Most pages are limited to one make and model and each list for a given year begins on February 1st, probably following a January inventory of the firearms. The books include both new and used firearms. Used guns owned by VL&D are called "Second Hand Guns" while consigned guns are called "Guns Left for Sale".

Although there are exceptions to each of the following, generally the firearms in Book 1 describe only the gauge, barrel length, weight and D@H. The name of the purchaser is recorded if other than a cash sale.

The firearms in Book 2 list the dates of acquisition and sale, most gun specifications and the purchasers but not the cost or price. The firearms in Book 3 list all of the above plus the price at which the gun was sold, in code.

Book 4 is a stock list of for 1913-1914 and includes many non-gun items. The guns in Book 4 show only make, model and serial number. It is uncertain if this is a VL&D or an A&F record.

Beginning in 1929 the record books are labeled A&F and there are 16 volumes up through 1965, Books 5 through 20. Most of the A&F volumes cover a period of 2 or 3 years each. From this point the records show all of the above information in the VL&D books plus the cost to A&F and the retail price of the firearm. These costs and prices are shown in code until Book 18 in 1962 when they began to be recorded in dollars.

A line drawn through a serial number simply means that the gun had been sold. Unsold guns were transferred to the next year's inventory pages as of February 1st. Those transferred are usually indicated by a red check mark. A large 'X' drawn across a page indicates that the inventory page had been completed. Serial numbers are almost never written in sequential order, rather they are by date of acquisition.

The name of the purchaser is often shown with an initial instead of the first name. The clients of A&F include some recognizable names and occasionally one will see entries for: WR Hearst, K. Roosevelt, (Kermit, son of TR), or JP Sousa, Jr (son of the conductor) among many others of note.

Stock dimensions, when listed, are in the order: Drop @ Heel, Drop @ Comb, LOP. Grip styles are listed as: "Str" (straight grip), "½ grip" (semi-pistol grip) or "FPG" (full pistol grip).

Frequently new guns were returned by the buyer and resold. These are re-entered in the new gun listings with the name of the former owner written above the date of acquisition.

All of the records were handwritten by human beings. As such, there is always the possibility of human error. Occasional serial number and date errors have been noted therefore it is quite reasonable to assume that there will be some mistakes in measurements as well. You own a piece of firearms history. Please accept the documents for the historical perspective that they add to your firearm and do not be too disappointed if they fail to meet 21st century standards for mechanical precision or computer accuracy.



Henry Root Stern (B.A. 1903, LL.B. and M.A. Columbia 1906) was born in New York City September 22, 1882, prepared at Morse's School, New York City, and Phillips Academy, Andover, Mass., and entered college in the fall of 1899.

His father, Simon Hunt Stern (Columbia Law School 1869), of the law firm of Stern and Rushmore, New York City, was born in Richmond, Virginia, October 13, 1849, the son of Meyer Stern and Diana (Hunt) Stern.

His mother, whose maiden name was Sara Stern, was the daughter of David Stern, a merchant, and of Rose (Mender-son) Stern.

A brother, Walter Thomas Stern (1899), preceded him at Yale.

In college Stern was on the Hockey team, was Chairman of the *Yale Record*, and a member of the Freshman Glee Club. He was Secretary and Treasurer of *Cercle Francais*, Manager of the first French play and a member of the Dramatic Association. He won in Senior year the DeForest Prize Medal. He was a member of Psi Upsilon and held a First Dispute Junior appointment and a Second Dispute Senior appointment.

He writes: "1. (a) Residence. 986 Fifth Avenue, New York, since 1903. I forget just what date I left college but it was as long after graduation as I could decently make it. (b) Occupation. Law student at Columbia during academic year—work in law office during summer—and on my own hook whenever I have had the chance. Will enter employ of law firm of Stern and Rushmore permanently, I hope, next June (1906). My father is senior partner, other members, Charles E. Rushmore and Eldon Bisbee. Nature of business—managing estates, commercial and banking law.

"2. As you are probably bored to extinction with attempted witticism in answer to this question, I will merely answer—nothing doing.

"3. Have been studying for an LL.B. at Columbia Law

School and have also taken the total of about ten hours a week in the Columbia School of Political Science during the three years since graduation. I expect next June to get an LL.B. and an M.A., the latter for political science. This is all contingent on passing final law examinations and on finishing a political science thesis.

"4. Various unsigned articles in editorial department of *Columbia Law Review*, since January 1905.

"5. (a) What do you mean by social organizations? Dancing classes or clubs? (b) Religious—None. (c) Politics, yes. I don't know whether you could call being elected at the primaries to the Democratic Convention Committee of the 29th District and subsequently to the General Committee of the same, also to the Osceola Club Ball Committee of 'de twenty-nint', offices of honor, trust and profit. Of course the honor is immense, but so far there has been a large absence of trust and profit. However, if my meteoric rise in politics continues I may yet be the proud possessor, in the course of years, of a job in the street cleaning department. I am a member of the legal fraternity of Phi Delta Phi and President of the Temple Moot Court Club at Columbia.

"Seriously though, in the course of the last year I have taken a good deal of interest in politics. Was one of the organizers of the Columbia Political Club and am Vice President and Chairman of the Executive Committee of said club, which is similar in object and character to the City Government Club at Yale. Have just returned from Washington from an interview which Roosevelt accorded to the various delegates of these college clubs, of which interview you may have heard.

"6. No journeys except between 116th Street and Wall Street. This last fall though took a month's trip off, about ten days in Laurentian district in Canada for trout, and then into New Brunswick along the Tobique River in the moose country with Bill Ray and Jim Pierce, a couple of '98 men. Splendid shooting and fishing; got a bull moose and lots of small game, Hope to get back there for a week in June for some salmon fishing.

"7. Permanent address: care Stern and Rushmore, 40 Wall Street, New York City.

"8. (a) Nothing else I can think of except being elected

an editor of the *Columbia Law Review* and passing my bar examinations last June (1905). Haven't been arrested yet for violating the speed laws, haven't eloped with any chorus girls nor have I yet stopped a runaway horse or saved a baby from drowning."

And later: "I received a degree of LL.B. from the Columbia Law School last June and also an M.A. from the School of Political Science, for which the aforesaid faculty charged me respectively \$25 per, and which I am now prepared to sell to any respectable party at a liberal discount."

John Henry Stevens (B.A. 1903) was born in Alton, N. H., January 28, 1880, prepared at the Phillips Academy, Exeter, N. H., and entered with the Class.

His father, Nathaniel Stevens, was a lumber merchant.

After graduation Stevens took a position with the North American Trust Company, New York City, and rose to be a teller. He has recently taken a position with William A. Read and Company, bankers, Pine and Nassau Sts., New York City. (See Addenda.)

John McAllister Stevenson, Jr., (B.A. 1903) was born in Pittsfield, Mass., August 26, 1881, prepared at the Pittsfield High School and at the Hotchkiss School, Lakeville, Conn., and entered college at the beginning of Freshman year.

His father, John McAllister Stevenson of the Class of Yale 1869, is Secretary of the Berkshire Mutual Fire Insurance Company and a member of Stevenson and Company, insurance agents of Pittsfield. He was born in Cambridge, Washington County, N. Y., August 31, 1846, the son of John McAllister Stevenson, a lawyer of Cambridge, N. Y., and of Seraph Huldah (Newton) Stevenson.

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Henry Stern, Jr., 80, Ex-Insurance Chief Of New York State

Henry Root Stern Jr., a former New York State Insurance Superintendent and trial attorney, died on July 7 at North Shore University Hospital in Glen Cove, L.I. He was 80 and lived in Glen Cove.

The cause was a heart attack, said his wife, the former Sarah Hamlin.

Mr. Stern was appointed by Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller in 1964 to the senior post in the Insurance Department, which regulates insurance companies operating in the state and handles policyholders' complaints. During his tenure, the state for the first time authorized Group Health Insurance to draw up a hospital insurance plan in competition with Blue Cross.

When his term as superintendent expired in 1967, Mr. Stern joined the Manhattan law firm, now known as Mudge Rose Guthrie Alexander & Ferdon, originally founded in 1869 by his grandfather, Simon Hunt Stern. He specialized in courtroom litigation and conducted a wide variety of trials until his retirement in 1981. Most Visible Case

Mr. Stern's first public office was that of assistant district attorney of Nassau County from 1946 to 1952. He won praise for his fairness but lost his most visible case, the trial of a Long Island Rail Road motorman on charges of causing the Rockville Centre accident on Feb. 17, 1950, that took 32 lives. The motorman was acquitted.

In 1952, Mr. Stern went into law practice with his father, Henry Root Stern Sr., a leading New York State Republican and former chairman of the State Board of Social Welfare. The Sterns formed the partnership of Sprague & Stern of Mineola, L.I., with J. Russel Sprague, former Nassau County Executive.

Mr. Stern, who was born in New York City, followed in his father's footsteps, graduating from Yale University and, in 1942, from Columbia Law School. As a lieutenant in the Navy, he saw combat at the Normandy landing and was awarded the Bronze Star.

He held numerous directorships, including the United States Life Insurance Company, the United States Life Income Fund and the Mental Health Association of Nassau County. He was also past director of the Nassau County Bar Association, member of the Ethics Committee of the Federal Bar Association and counsel to the Committee on Legal Aspects of Psychiatry of the American Psychiatric Association.

Besides his wife of 55 years, surviving are: two sons, Geoffrey of Queens and Peter; a daughter, Elizabeth of Taos, N.M., and four grandchildren.
