To whom it may concern:

Parker shotgun, serial number 236165 was completed on January 17, 1933. According to Parker Bros. Stock Book No. 82 it was a BHE hammerless, single trigger, 20 gauge. It featured 26 inch Acme steel barrels with a chamber length of 2 5/8. Its stock configuration was a straight grip. According to the Parker Bros. Stock Book, its specifications were Length of Pull: 14 1/2, Drop at Comb: 1 1/2, Drop at Heel: 2 1/2, and Weight: 6 to 6 1/2 pounds.

The price listed in the 1933 price list for a BHE grade was \$365.20

Parker Bros., Remington Arms and others repaired and reconfigured guns as a major part of the gun trade. Over the years this Parker may have undergone many changes to suit its owners. In the past twenty-five years concerns for restoration and preservation of the old Parker have revitalized interest in the "Old Reliable", and today it leads the list of collectible American shotguns. The quality was built in; if it says Parker it is still the "Old Reliable".

DIRECTIONS

The gun opens or closes your gun with undue force as injury to the mechanism may result. Open the gun until the hammers engage in the hammer notches and do not slam it open or shut. Keep all bearing points clean and oiled.

All PARKER fore-ends are fitted tightly.

DO NOT TRY TO FORCE THE LOCK LEVER INTO PLACE. SQUEEZE THE FORE END WOOD INTO THE BARREL, EXERTING PRESSURE JUST BACK OF THE FORE END LOCK AND THE LOCKER WILL DROP INTO PLACE, LOCKING THE FORE END TO THE BARREL.

In all guns have an fore and lock lever. Simply use force enough to force fore end in proper place.

Let hammers down, remove shells and pull triggers before shooting.

HAMMERS SHOULD NEVER BE LET DOWN ON LOADED SHELLS IN ANY GUN.

The Parker Gun is a much safer gun to use than any gun in which the hammers may be let down on loaded shells and was designed with special reference to safety on this particular point.

IT DOES NO HARM TO SNAP HAMMERS DOWN ON PARKER GUNS WHEN NOT LOADED. SNAP THEM ALL YOU PLEASE.

We advise snapping hammers down when gun is not in use (it relieves tension on the springs).

After dismantling the barrels the top lever should be released by pushing down on the trip which is located in the rear of the lug slot in the frame where barred lug fits, (see cut-over side). A shows how to use a small stick to depress trip. After top lever is in place the safety slide may be pushed forward, triggers pulled and the hammers snapped down.


If the gun is fitted with our automatic ejector, it is an excellent plan to have in the gun two expended shells so that when the gun is opened and the ejectors operated they will have some work to do otherwise the force of the blow transmitted by the ejectors being thrown against the stop plate tends to batter them and injure the plate.




