A very rare pair of flintlock double-barreled dueling pistols, signed by Dublin, Ireland gun manufacturer Lewis Alley. Each gun has a walnut stock with finely engraved steel mounts. The guns, along with the steel bullet mold, are encased in the original box bearing the trade label of Wm. and Jn. Rigby. The case measures 16 3/4" wide x 8 5/8" deep x 3 1/4" high. Irish. Circa 1775.

A very rare and unusual 5mm pinfire six-shot pepperbox revolver in the Mafioso style. The handle is in the shape of brass knuckles, which fold away to be used as such. There is also a small dagger that folds out. There is engraving on the knuckles, as well as in both sides of the gun frame. There is a serial #217 and a hallmark of "DB" with a crown and acanthus leaves in between the letters. Belgian. Circa 1860.
