Subject: Research on cased L. C. Smith double shotgun.

L.C. Smith double shotgun S/N 201295 manufactured as a Pigeon Grade with automatic ejectors was the middle of twelve grades of shotguns manufactured by Hunter Arms Co. before 1913. There were five lower grades (00, 0, 1, 2 & 3) and six higher grades (No. 4, A-1, No. 5, Monogram, A-2 & A-3).


The Pigeon Grade was manufactured between 1895 and 1913 and was offered in 12 and 16 gauge Chainette Damascus barrels and 12 and 16 gauge fluid steel barrels. Barrel lengths were available in 26-, 28-, 30- or 32 inch. There were 320 guns made with non-ejectors and 894 made with ejectors for a total of 1214 guns.

Stocks were of figured French walnut with either pistol grip or straight styles with Forends that were either Beaver or Splinter.

This particular L. C. Smith, S/N 201295 was made during the year 1903 and was between July 22, 1903 (S/N 201289) and August 18, 1903 (S/N 201297) which were shipped from the factory at their respectively noted dates. This piece was apparently delivered with both the Chainette Damascus and the fluid steel barrel. The fluid steel barrels have the Hunter Arms Proof Mark with the Arm and Bolts of Lightning.

Suggested value of the L. C. Smith as delivered with both barrels is \$1200.00.
