Boss Over/Under Shotgun
Serial No. 7946

Boss Over/Under shotgun, serial number 7946, was specially ordered at Abercrombie & Fitch on June 16, 1938 and received in inventory on September 30, 1938. The shotgun was entered on page 7 of Inventory Book No. 7, section 3 and the following specifications are recorded:

Barrels:	26 inch barrels, with ejectors
Weight:	unspecified
Choke:	Improved Cylinder & Improved Cylinder
Dimensions:	2 1/2 in. Drop @ Heel x 1 1/2 in. Drop @ Comb
Trigger:	Single Trigger
Rib:	Raised Rib

The shotgun appears to have been one of the Boss sales that resulted from the yearly visits of Mr. Robert Robertson, a senior member of Boss & Co. and “one of the world’s best known gun fitters and shooting coach.”

Boss 7946 was sold to “Dr. C.H. Emlund” and “Delivered in Person” to the buyer. The sale was recorded on September 30, 1938. There is no indication of the weight, length of pull, the cost or the retail price of the Boss in the A&F records. The catalog price of a Boss O/U in 1938 was \$1,156 not including extra charges for the selective single trigger or the raised rib.

Griffin & Howe confirms that this information was extracted from the original Abercrombie & Fitch Inventory Records: Book No. 7, section 3, page 7 and a period A&F catalog on August 10, 2016.

NOTES ON

Boss Best Over/Under Shotgun Serial No. 7946

Boss shotgun, number 7946, was a special order for "Dr. C.H. Ernlund" and appears in the 1938 inventory of Boss firearms received at Abercrombie & Fitch, then located at Madison Avenue & 45th Street in Manhattan, New York City. Boss 7946 appears on page 7 of A&F Inventory Book No.7, Section 1 as the fifth entry from the bottom of the page. A new inventory was begun each February 1st and the date of the inventory year appears at the top left corner of the photograph of page 7. The date of acquisition is in the "Received" column and is followed by the serial number, gauge, and barrel length, Ejectors, and chokes. The chamber lengths, weight, length of pull and type of grip have been omitted, perhaps because the measurements were thought unnecessary as the shotgun was already sold to the customer. The "Consigned" column contains the entry "Single Trig., Raised Rib, H'less" indicating that the shotgun was a hammerless model supplied with a single trigger and a raised rib.

The "Sold" column has two dates. The earlier date of "5-16-38" would be the date that the order was placed and the later date of "9-30-38" would be the date that the gun was 'sold'. This date is the same date as the date of acquisition and would be in keeping with the standard practice at A&F when the gun was a special order for the customer. Many of the sales of Boss shotguns at A&F in the 1930's were as a result of a consultation with Mr. Robert Robertson, Managing Director of Boss & Co., who visited A&F in the spring of each year for the purpose of doing gun fittings for customers who wished to purchase a Boss. The initials in the "Sold by" column which represent the salesman for the transaction are "Rob". This entry indicates that the gun was sold by Mr. Robertson.

The "Name" column contains the name of the buyer, "Dr. C.H. Ernlund". This customer would have been Doctor Carl (Karl) Helge Ernlund, born in Brunsta, Sweden on February 9, 1889. Carl Ernlund studied at the College of Lund and the University of Uppsala in Sweden before immigrating to the United States where he received his D.M.D in 1917 and his M.D. in 1922, both from Harvard University. Dr. Ernlund arrived in the United States as a "Student" on September 13, 1912 aboard the S.S. Adriatic and became a naturalized citizen in Boston, Massachusetts in 1940. In the 1930 census, Dr. Ernlund was recorded residing in a guest house on Bay State Road in Boston and his occupation was recorded as a Surgical

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Physician with his specialty involving diseases of the throat and larynx. On July 15, 1933 he married Lucy Maxwell Hodge of Princeton, New Jersey. Miss Hodge's father, Casper Wistar Hodge, taught at the Princeton Theological Seminary and officiated at the wedding. The couple returned to Boston where they resided at 170 Coolidge Hill in Cambridge. Dr. Ernlund's office was at 5 Bay State Road in Boston. On July 1, 1941, Dr. Ernlund sold a Daly 410 gauge over/under shotgun, number 6144, to Abercrombie & Fitch in New York for which he received \$75.00. This transaction is recorded on A&F Record of Purchase form 2589, a copy of which is enclosed. This form records "5 Bay State Road, Boston, Mass." as Dr. Ernlund's address. He was an accomplished pianist, painter, skeet shooter and fisherman and he was a member of the Jaffrey Gun Club in New Hampshire where he and his wife were skeet shooters. It is very likely that Dr. Ernlund used Boss 7946 as a skeet competitor beginning in the late 1930's. Carl Helge Ernlund passed away in Boston, Massachusetts on June 6, 1984.

The cost and the retail price of Boss 7946 were not entered, perhaps because the customer chose to pay Boss & Co. directly for some tax advantage. The "Cost" column contains the entry "Delivered in Person" which indicates that the gun was delivered directly to Dr. Ernlund. Two similar Boss shotguns on page 7, numbers 8044 and 8515, were in inventory that same year. The cost and retail price of those two shotguns are written in code in the "Cost" and "Selling Price" columns. This code is based upon the word H-Y-D-R-O-P-L-A-N-E, where H=1, Y=2, D=3, etc. The number '0' is indicated by the letter 'E', however, the letter 'X' is alternately used to indicate an additional '0'. Using this code it can be seen that the retail prices of each of those two Boss Over/Under shotguns on page 7 were 'HYLO.EX' which translates to \$1,275.00. The cost of number 8044 was 'NPE.LY' which translates to \$960.72. The letters 'IF.OG' below the cost code represent the excise tax. The code for the excise tax was a simple substitution where A=1, B=2, C=3, etc. with the numeral 0 represented by the letter "O". Using this code the excise tax (IF.OG) of 8044 translates to \$96.07. Similarly the cost of 8515 was \$712.50 with an additional \$69.83 in excise tax. According to the price list in a 1938 A&F catalog, the "Landed in U.S." price of a Boss Over/Under with a single selective trigger and a raised rib would have been \$1263.25. A copy of that catalog page is enclosed.

I hope that this information adds to the appreciation of your firearm. If we can be of any further assistance, please let us know.

Interpreting the VL&D and A&F Records

The VL&D Record Books begin in 1901 and cover the period through 1929. There are 3 volumes: Book 1 covers 1901 to 1909, Book 2 covers 1910 to 1922, and Book 3 covers 1923 to 1929. Most pages are limited to one make and model and each list for a given year begins on February 1st, probably following a January inventory of the firearms. The books include both new and used firearms. Used guns owned by VL&D are called "Second Hand Guns" while consigned guns are called "Guns Left for Sale".

Although there are exceptions to each of the following, generally the firearms in Book 1 describe only the gauge, barrel length, weight and D@H. The name of the purchaser is recorded if other than a 'cash sale'.

The firearms in Book 2 list the dates of acquisition and sale, most gun specifications and the purchasers but not the cost or price. The firearms in Book 3 list all of the above plus the price at which the gun was sold, in code.

Book 4 is a Von Lengerke & Antoine stock list of for 1913-1914 and includes many gun and non-gun items. The guns in Book 4 show only make, model and serial number. VL&A was purchased along with VL&D in 1929.

Beginning in 1929 the record books are labeled A&F and there are 28 volumes up through 1977. The A&F volumes cover a period of 1, 2 or 3 years. From this point the records show all of the above information in the VL&D books plus the cost to A&F and the retail price of the firearm. These costs and prices are shown in code until Book 16 in 1960 when they began to be recorded in dollars.

A line drawn through a serial number simply means that the gun had been sold. Unsold guns were transferred to the next year's inventory pages as of February 1st. Those transferred are often indicated by a red check mark. A large 'X' drawn across a page indicates that the inventory page had been completed. Serial numbers are almost never written in sequential order; rather they are by date of acquisition.

The name of the purchaser is often shown with an initial instead of the first name. The clients of A&F include some recognizable names and occasionally one will see entries for: WR Hearst, K. Roosevelt, (Kermit, son of TR), or JP Sousa, Jr (son of the conductor) among many others of note.

Stock dimensions, when listed, are in the order: Drop @ Heel, Drop @ Comb, LOP. Grip styles are listed as: "Str" (straight grip), "1/2" (semi-pistol grip) or "F" (full pistol grip).

Occasionally new gun sales were cancelled or the guns were returned by the buyer and resold. These were re-entered in the new gun listings with the name of the former owner written above the date of acquisition.

All of the records were handwritten by human beings. As such, there is always the possibility of human error. Occasional serial number and date errors have been noted therefore it is quite reasonable to assume that there will be some mistakes in measurements as well. You own a piece of firearms history. Please accept the documents for the historical perspective that they add to your firearm and do not be too disappointed if they fail to meet 21st century standards for mechanical precision or computer accuracy.

According to the *Newark Evening News* of July 24, Mayor Simeon H. 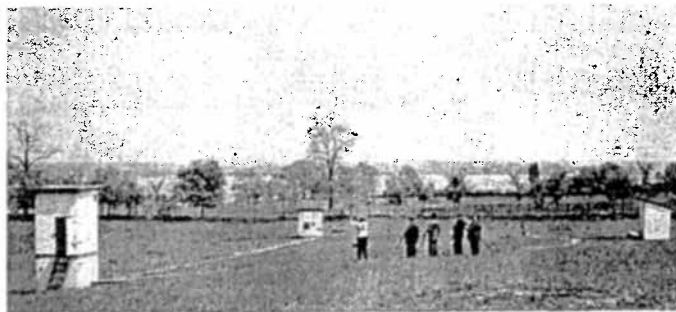
