## Graybill Mohler, was mail carrier

Graybill E. "Bill" Mohler, 70, of 230 Edgewood Drive, New Holland, died Saturday morning at Lancaster General Hospital after a short illness. *2-28-93*

A U.S. Postal Service mail carrier for 32 years, he worked a rural route for six years and the New Holland route for 26 years.

Mohler was the husband of Helen Kochel Mohler. They observed their 48th wedding anniversary in October.

He was a member of Trinity Lutheran Church in New Holland.

A corporal in the U.S. Army Air Corps during World War II in Germany, he was a mechanic.

He was a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, Charles E. Ludwig Post 7362; and the National Association of Retired Federal Employees. He liked classic cars.

Born in Ephrata Township, he was a son of the late Frank W. and Elizabeth Eby Mohler.
