Dear Morrie,

Since I have persisted in putting too many desirable guns in my own collection, I find once again that I must put something up for sale.

I have Griswold's Gunnison revolver, serial # 2198, which I thought might be of interest to you. This gun is pictured on page 16 of Albaugh's + Simmons book, The Confederate Brass Frames Colt + Whitney which was one of the 1st books on Confederate revolvers (see enclosed pages). This was in Albaugh's collection at the time the book was written. It is also mentioned on pg. 21 of the same book. This same gun is pictured and described on pages 142 + 143 of the book Confederate Presentation + Inscribed Swords + Revolvers by Daniel Hartlyer and a brief history is included. (See enclosed pages). I also have National archive records on him. Inscribed Confederate manufactured revolvers are an extreme rarity and this one is especially desirable for two other reasons. First, this gun has original blue on the bottom of the barrel as well as traces on the barrel housing. Case colors are still bright on the loading lever, which I have not seen survive on any other Confederate revolver.

Secondly, Brown was one of the Immortal 600, about which more than one book has been written. Wounded and captured at Gettysburg, Brown and the others which made up this heroic group, were eventually placed on an island off the coast of S. Carolina and were used as human shields by the Federal Troops, to prevent the Confederate forces in Charleston from firing on them.

This is a vast simplification of what happened. I have the book describing the situation, as well as a Regimental History of the 7th VA. All this material goes with the gun, except for the Hartley book, which I imagine is obtainable.

Moore, this gun without its inscription and association with the Immortal 600 is worth \$35,000. With the inscription it's hard to know what it might bring on the open market - perhaps \$60,000. I would prefer to sell it privately and to someone who is a good friend and who will appreciate it and for that reason will take \$50,000.

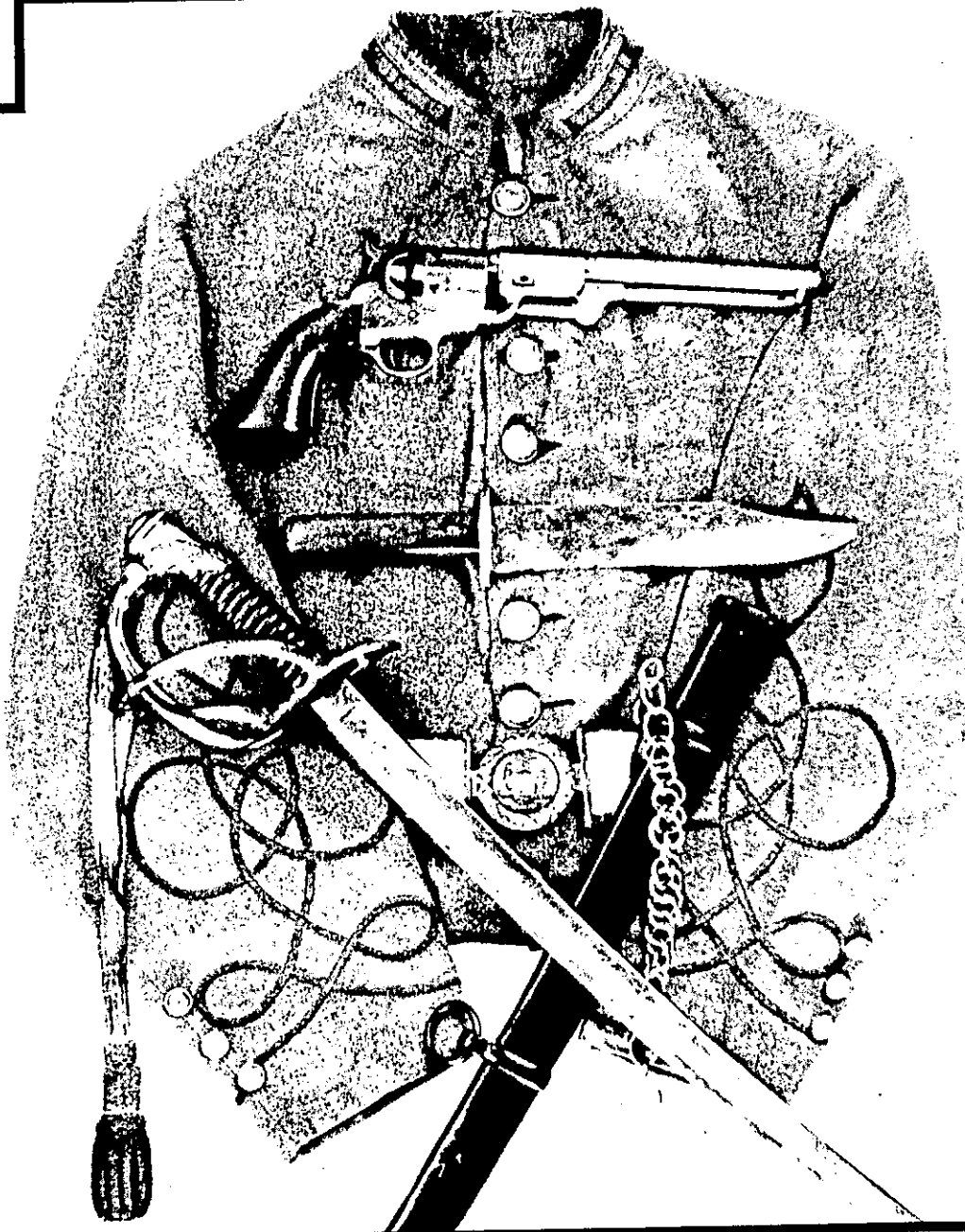
By the way, Brown's records show him as Captain, not Major. I don't know if that was an error, whether he was later promoted, or whether he promoted himself.

Please let me know if you want this piece because I haven't offered it to anyone else yet.

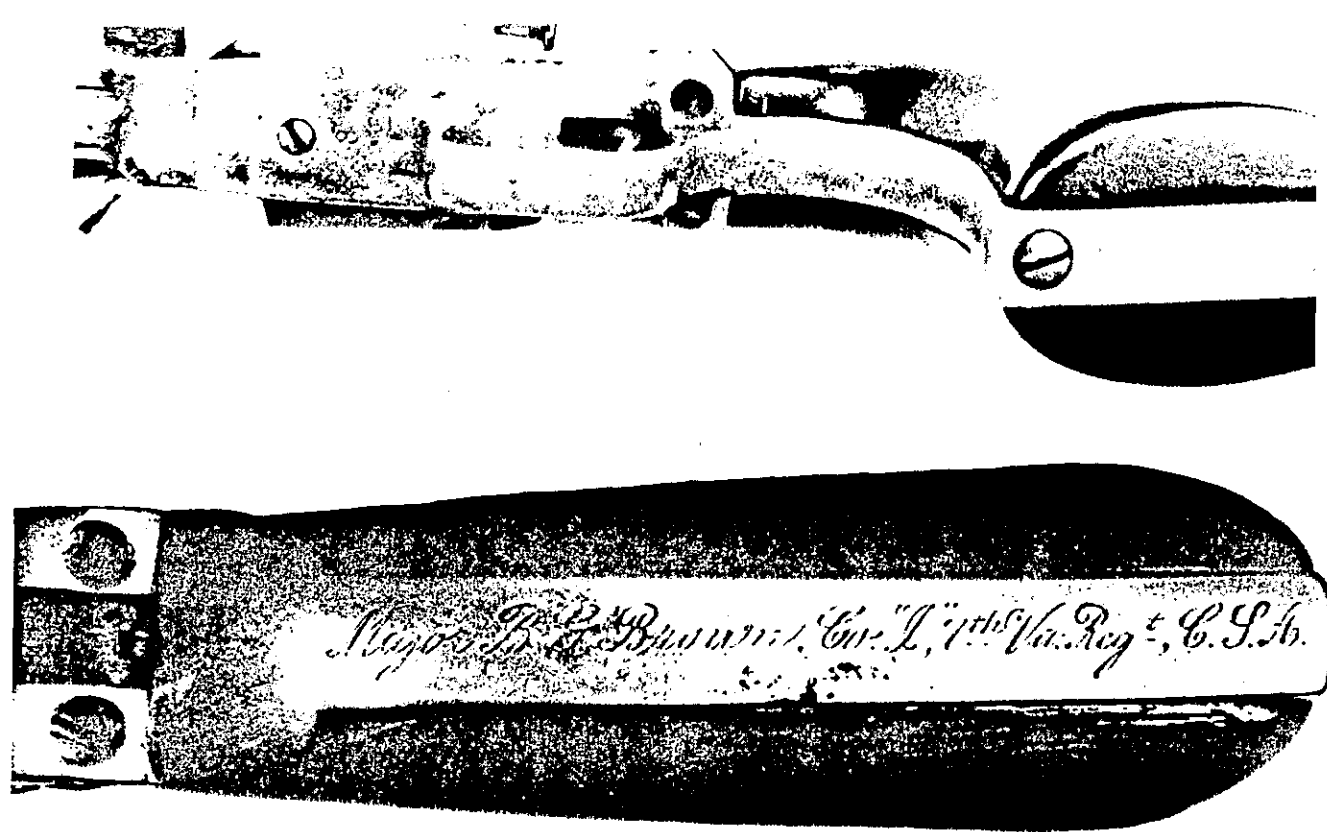

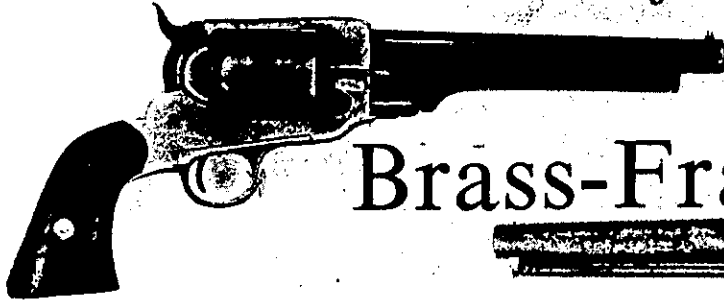


FRANKLIN BUCHANAN

Franklin Buchanan, 1800 - 1874, was born in the Druid Hill section of Baltimore. He became a midshipman in the United States Navy at the age of fifteen on board The Java, a man of war. In February of 1821 he became second officer on board The Dorothea and on January 13, 1825 a lieutenant. On September 3, 1841, Buchanan was commissioned a commander. In August of 1845 he was chosen the first superintendent of the Naval Academy at Annapolis which he assisted in founding. With the beginning of the Mexican War, he immediately requested sea service but was turned down. His request was renewed several times and on March 9, 1847, Buchanan's wishes became reality when he took command of the newly completed sloop, Germantown, and sailed for the Gulf of Mexico. He was honored for his gallant service in the war by the state legislature and he was given one hundred and fifty acres in Iowa by the United State Congress. He served after the war on several naval boards along with a lighthouse committee and com-

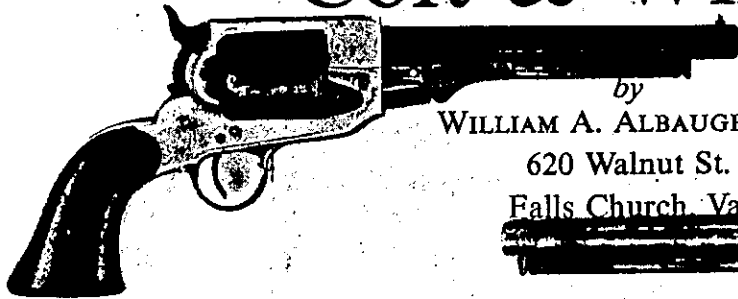
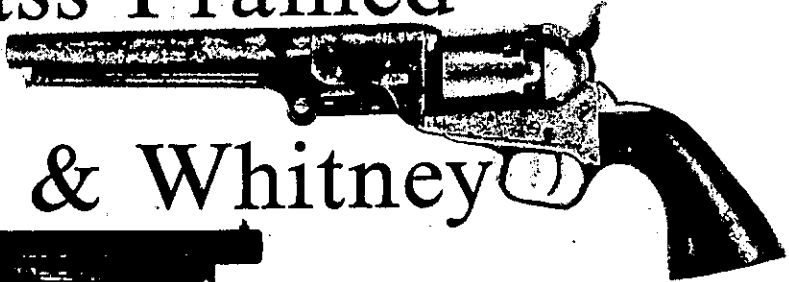
manded the Baltimore Rendezvous. He commanded Commodore Perry's flagship in the expedition to Japan. With the new promotion of efficiency that the navy experienced in 1855, Buchanan was promoted to captain and had more sea service than any other commander. On May 26, 1859, he was ordered to the Washington Naval Yard. On April 22, 1861, feeling that Maryland would secede, he resigned his commission and retired with his family to his home, "The Rest", on the Miles River in Talbot County. Maryland had not acted and on May 4 he wrote the Secretary of the Navy recalling his resignation but was informed that it had been accepted. Realizing that his state was shackled and could not join the Confederacy, on August 31 he appeared before a justice of the peace in Easton to legally acknowledge indentures of all his personal and real property to members of his family. This was a very wise action for, unknown to him, soon the Federal Government would confiscate all property of those Marylanders who were serving in the Con-

Nov. 11, 1864, Gen. W. Tecumseh Sherman, U. S. A., began his easy but destructive march from Atlanta to the sea. His columns were spread to a width of 40 miles! The effect was very much like that of a railroad train coming in sideways. Damage done by those wanton raiders who destroyed for the sheer love of malicious destruction is beyond calculation, and even after 90 years the effects remain, and will remain—physically and spiritually.

A small division of the Confederate Gen. Joe Wheeler's cavalry pegged away on the advancing columns, and at Macon, Ga., Gen. Howl. Cobb brought out a division of Georgia Home Guards and Militia in a fruitless attempt to cut the huge serpent in two. Included in this militia were our old friends the "Rigdon Guards" of Augusta, Ga.

The serpent was not cut, but it was diverted and Macon was spared the torch.

State Militia (composed of workers, old men, and boys) against trained U.S. soldiers! The Battle of Griswoldville Station, was fought on a little knoll, about a mile east of the town. Certainly if the above listing were more complete some sort of a pattern would appear, but even so, examination will disclose some facts. We note that at least two of the revolvers were made without any serial numbers at all. If two have survived at this late date, we can but wonder how many might have originally been made without serials and why they were so made? Were they the first, or the last? Further note that the only two revolvers within close range of each other on which complete markings have been obtained are #2184, whose Roman numeral is XVII, and #2198 whose Roman numeral is XI. This would in some way substantiate the theory that the Roman numerals went only to XX (20) and then started again, for if #2184 is XVII, it would follow #2185 was XVIII, #2186 would be XIX, etc., until we reach #2198 which would be, and is XI.

A variation is noted in #2231, which has as a secondary serial #41, rather than the expected #31, or 10 higher than is normally found. Looking

The 7th Virginia Infantry was organized in May 1861 and mustered into Confederate service on July 1, 1861. The 7th Virginia Infantry was assigned to Kemper's Brigade, Army of Northern Virginia during its service. Bezaliel Brown Sr. was commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant in the 7th Virginia Infantry on July 1, 1861. Lt. Brown was promoted to Captain on April 26, 1862. During Captain Brown's service with the 7th Virginia Infantry, he saw action in the following engagements; Blackburn's Ford, 1st Battle of Bull Run, Yorktown Siege, Williamsburg, Seven Pines, Seven Days Battles, 2nd Battle of Bull Run, Antietam, 2nd Battle of Fredericksburg, and Gettysburg. On July 3, 1863, Captain Brown's 7th Virginia Infantry was assigned to Kemper's Brigade, Pickett's Division, and participated in Pickett's Charge at Gettysburg. As a result of this action, Captain Brown was captured by Union forces and held as a prisoner of war until April 1865 when he was paroled following the surrendered of Confederate forces at the Appomattox Court House.

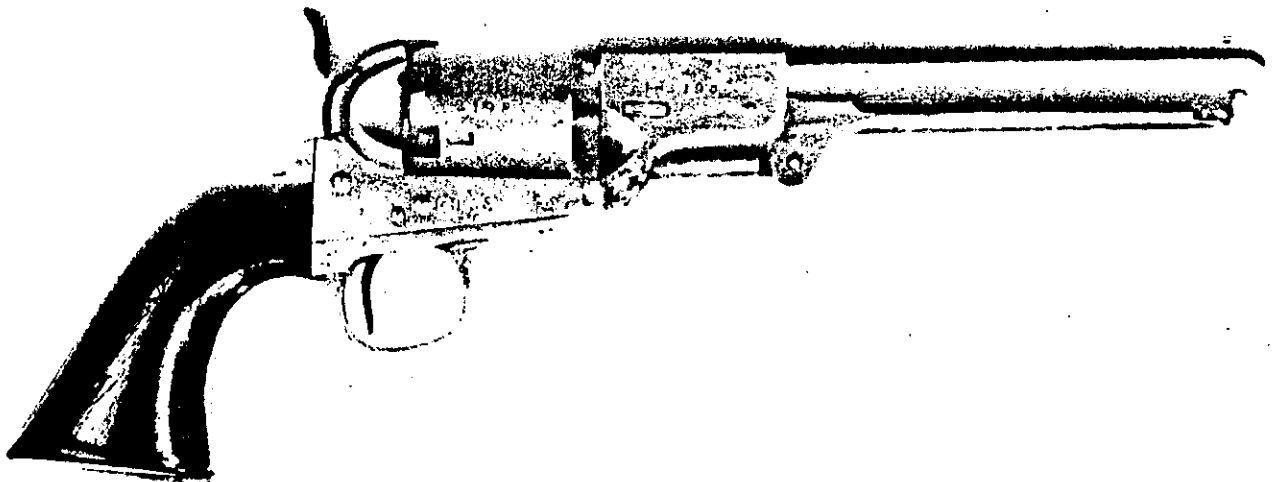
Samuel Griswold, A.W. Gunnison - Griswoldville, Georgia

Bezaliel G. Brown, 1837 - , of Albemarle County, Virginia enlisted on June 3, 1861, at White Hall and was mustered in the Holcombe Guards on June 11 at Charlottesville. On July 1 he was appointed 2nd lieutenant in the 7th Virginia Infantry Company I. April 26, 1862, elections brought the three bars of captain to his uniform. He was wounded in the left leg and

captured at Gettysburg on July 31, 1863, and sent to Baltimore, then to Pointed Lookout. On June 25, 1864, he was transferred to Fort Delaware and forwarded to Hilton Head, South Carolina on August 20, where the six hundred prisoners were placed under fire of their own guns. After being returned to Fort Delaware, he was released on March 12, 1865.

This revolver was a product of Samuel Griswold and A.W. Gunnison, who were the largest producers of navy repeating revolvers in the South. Griswold was the proprietor and Gunnison, a longtime associate, was at least superintendent, for ordnance and arsenal communications refers to Messrs Griswold and Gunnison as contractors. The pistol is marked with the full serial no. 2198 on the iron barrel housing. Of the three thousand and six hundred manufactured, this one was delivered just after the new year of 1864. The secondary number "8" is found on all other major parts, even the hammer, hand and trigger. The cast brass parts are scratched with the Roman numeral "XX". The cryptic mark is an alphabetical backwards "R" letter that is on the barrel, frame, cylinder between one of the nipple, trigger guard and backstrap. The brass parts show faults from coarse sand casting and the backstrap is engraved in script "Major B.G. Brown Co. I 7th Va Regt. C.S.A.". The wood grips of walnut look to be too small, but this is because green wood was used. Iron was extensively used for these pistols in place of steel because of the scarcity, but they were still plagued by the lack of iron and brass. In the spring of 1862, an appeal was made to the patriotic local congregations to give their church bells because of the urgent need for brass. The Macon churches responded and the bells were accepted and melted down at the local arsenal.

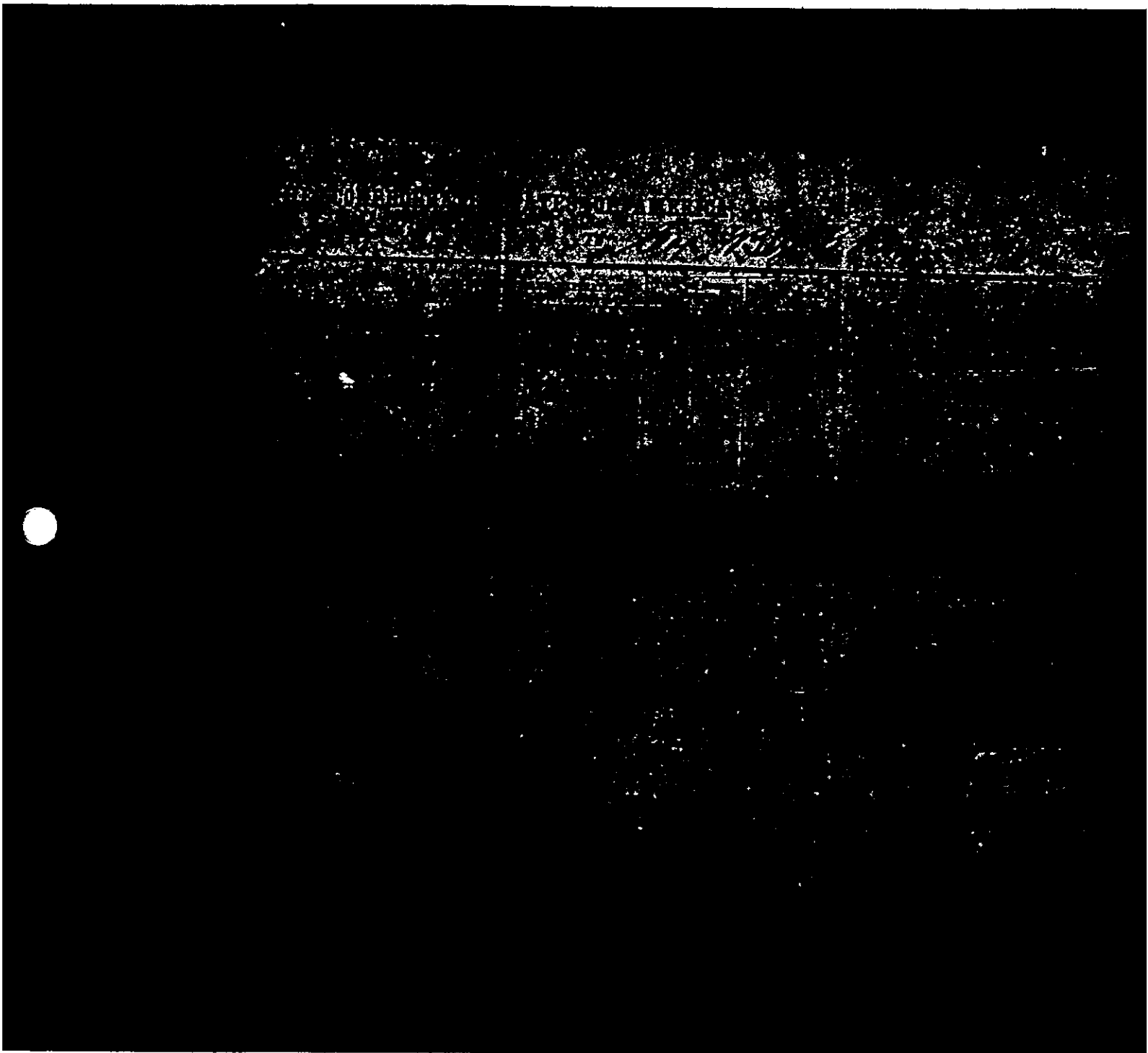

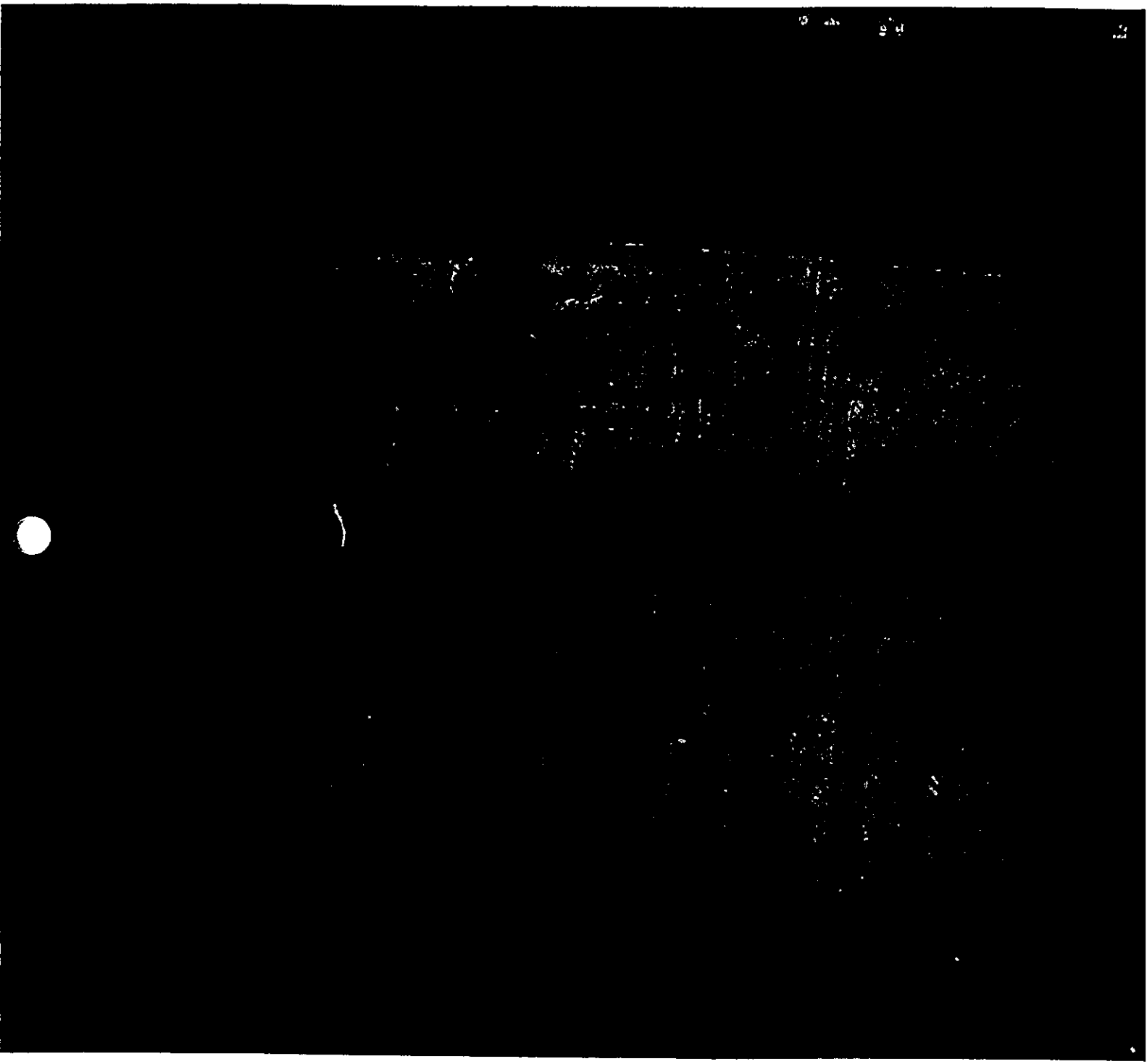

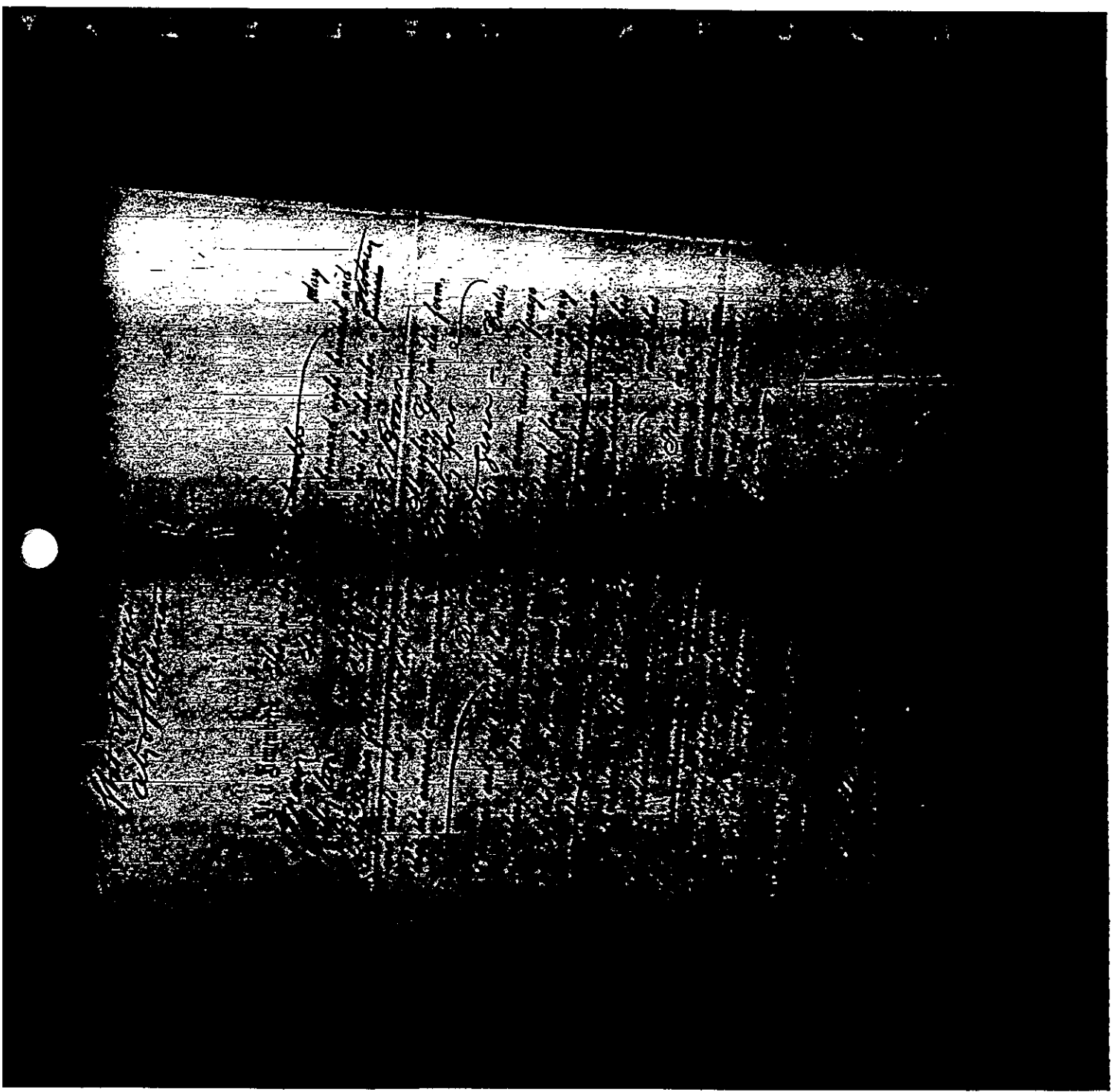
