

COLONEL CHARLES ASKINS' RIFLE

308 NORMA MAGNUM, WINCHESTER PRE-64 MODEL 70

CONVERTED TO LEFT HAND BY THE KERR SPORT SHOP OF BEVERLY HILLS



Colonel Charles Askins was a noted gun writer of the 20<sup>th</sup> century who, being left handed during a time when few, if any, options existed for port siders, had many rifles converted to left handed operation.

This rifle is from Colonel Askins' collection. It is a model 70 Winchester, converted by the Kerr Sport shop of Beverly Hills for the Colonel. It was featured in several of his articles and went with him on multiple trips to Alaska.

This is a rare opportunity to own a historic piece of gun writer history.
